Bachelors Have Rough Time

It has long been known that single persons, both men and women, are poorer medical risks than are married persons. Insurance companies tend to look a bit askance at them.

Perhaps single men are more likely to dissipate, and to pick up the several diseases that one can acquire through dissipation. I was just reading in a Report from the World Health Organization, Technical Report Series, 1959, that the percentage of married men and women over 65 years of age found in hospitals is relatively small.

In England and Wales two-thirds of all the older patients found in general and mental hospitals are single or widowed or divorced. While the percentage of the persons over 65 in the total population who never married is 12.6 per cent, in the mental hospitals the single old people contribute 55.4 per cent to the admissions! I imagine the main reason for this is that people who are alone in the world, when they fall ill, have no one to take care of them.

U.N. Adds 24 Nations in '50s

New York—UPI—The United Nations added 24 countries to its membership rolls during the 1950s, from 58 nations in 1950 to 82 today.

In the past decade two of the Axis powers of World War II, Japan and Italy, became U.N. members. The world organization also enrolled the Soviet satellites of Hungary, Rumania and Bulgaria, and admitted Spain and Portugal.

The decline of colonialism in Africa and Asia is reflected in the list of new U.N. members. It includes the newly-independent states of Malaya, Laos, Indonesia, Cambodia, Ghana, Libya, Morocco, Tunisia, Sudan and the Republic of Guinea.
