

Quake Drains Water Supply

Kodiak, Alaska—UPI—A series of earth shocks apparently opened up a giant fissure at the bottom of this city's main water supply and drained more than 61 million gallons from the reservoir either Christmas day or Dec. 26, it was announced Monday.

The tremors, described as extremely strong, caused no other damage in the city itself. However, residents were faced with the fact that the water they were using Monday was contaminated. It was being pumped directly into lines from nearby lakes.

The reservoir was dry Monday morning and a coat of ice covered portions of the mucky ground. The exact size of the fissure was not immediately determined, due to the ice and mud that cascaded down with the water.

'Adopted Child' Term Liberalized

Congress has liberalized the definition of an "adopted child" of a veteran eligible to receive benefits administered by the Veterans administration, S. T. Brannock, contact representative, VA District Office, Camp White, said today.

If at the time of the veteran's death, the child was living in the veteran's household, and if the child is legally adopted by the veteran's surviving spouse within two years after the veteran's death, he or she is considered to be the veteran's adopted child, Brannock explained.

Formerly, the adoption proceedings had to be completed before the veteran's death for the child to be eligible for any of the benefits, including compensation, pension, war orphans educational assistance, dependency and indemnity compensation, and accrued benefits.

If at the time of the veteran's death, however, the child was receiving regular contributions toward its support from an individual other than the veteran or his spouse, or from any public or private welfare organization, then the child may not be recognized as the veteran's legally adopted child, Brannock explained.

Goldfine Probe Demand Studied

Washington—UPI—An attorney for Boston financier Bernard Goldfine says his demand for an investigation into the source of reports that his client owes \$8 million in back taxes has been referred to the Justice Department.

The lawyer, Edward Bennett Williams, said Monday he received notification of the action from Elliott L. Richardson, U.S. attorney in Boston. Williams had requested a grand jury investigation to determine who was "criminally responsible for the divulgence" of the published information that Goldfine had been found by tax agents to owe between \$8 and \$9 million.

Great Northern Trains Operating

Seattle—UPI—The Great Northern Railway got its Empire Builder passenger train out of town Monday afternoon, only about 24 hours after two slides had ripped up two sections of track between Carkeek Park and Richmond Beach, north of here.

There was a delay at the slide area, but the train continued on its way after a 20-minute wait. Railway officials then announced that one-way traffic would be in effect until work crews cleared debris from the other set of tracks, which run along Puget Sound.

The slides occurred Sunday afternoon, derailing nine cars and injuring four passengers.

Justice Moves Slow in Japan

Mito, Japan—UPI—Twelve years ago in 1947, Shozo Ueno, 19, was ordered to appear before a summary court on suspicion of theft. He was allowed to return home.

In 1949, he again was called to the court, to be fingerprinted. Again he was allowed to return home.

In 1954, he made another appearance before the court on the theft charge.

Five years passed without a word from the court. Monday, the judge and prosecutor decided that Ueno, now 31, was innocent.
