Women Shouldn't Blame Themselves

I get so many sad letters from women who have had a defective child — perhaps a mentally retarded one, or a mongoloid child, or perhaps a psychopathic delinquent child.

The mother says she feels so guilty and so ashamed.

This seems all wrong. There is only one type of woman who, I think, might feel guilty as she looks at two or three defective children — and she is the woman who went ahead and married a charming alcoholic scamp when she knew that some members of her family carried a strong tendency to produce defective children.

Perhaps a genetic counselor or had told her that the chances were that if she married a man from a bad stock, three out of four of her children could be abnormal. If, with this knowledge, she went ahead and married a man with several insane relatives, and then had two or three children who were a terrible sorrow to her, I wouldn't blame her for feeling guilty.

But I don't for a moment blame the type of woman who just came into my office — terribly distressed over her epileptic and mentally retarded boy, and her epileptic and mentally retarded girl. I won't let that woman blame herself, because she came of good nervous and mental stock. What she did not know when she married a handsome and attractive man was that he was a good-for-nothing alcoholic who came of a family in which there were several epileptics.

Feels Sorrow
When I showed her the file of letters that I have received recently from a number of young women who want my advice about marrying a man who they realize they should not marry, she said, "How I wish I could talk to him and tell him, first, of the suffering I had with my man before I had to divorce him, and now the sorrow I feel every time I look at those two children."

Other women wrote that when they married an alcoholic ne'er-do-well from a bad family, they knew they shouldn't be doing it, but they thought their love would reform him. They soon found that they couldn't change him a bit. What they wish now is that, at least, they had refused to have (defective) children by him.

Often, when a woman writes me, blaming herself for having borne a defective child, I feel like asking her how she knows that the bad heredity all came through her.

Perhaps it all came through her husband. When I started out in medicine, most married women who could not have children felt terribly guilty, and usually were made to take all the blame for their supposed sterility. Today, we know that in many cases it is the husband who is

entirely at fault. I get dozens of letters from mothers who have been nearly killed by the entirely unjustified accusation of a psychiatrist that their psychopathic or homosexual or criminal child is the way he is because years ago they loved him too much, or were too indulgent with him, or something. I agree with those experts who maintain that in most of these cases the emotional environment could not possibly have produced the defect in the child's brain.

Need For Water in the Body
I was just reading an interesting book, "The Ocean of Air," by David I. Blumenthal (Rutgers University Press, New Brunswick, N.J.). In it he tells of studies made on soldiers in the desert. With the thermometer of 100 degrees F. a soldier sitting in the shade sweated three-fourths of a quart per hour, and when he was walking at 3.4 miles per hour, he lost a quart an hour.

This enormous drain on his body water on some days totaled over 2 gallons, and this loss had to be made up by drinking much water. If the man got lost on the desert and couldn't get water, his temperature would rise; he would get to breathing rapidly; he would feel tingling and numbness, and his heart would start throbbing violently; he would be seized with violent cramps, and fits of vomiting.

Soon he would be moving with difficulty as though half paralyzed. The man would become confused, and things would seem to him to be far away. He would get visions. When he had lost water equaling more than a twelfth of his body weight, if the air temperature remained high, his body temperature would suddenly rise, and if relief did not come quickly, he would soon be dead.

This would suggest that if, as sometimes happens, a man's car breaks down on a summer's day, on a lonely road in the desert, he had better not start walking for help. He had better lie down under his car and wait until night comes, and the desert cools off, as it does. Then he can walk — if he is sure he won't lose his sense of direction.
