## California Governor Will Call Legislature on Smog Problem

Los Angeles - (UPI) - Gov. Edmund G. Brown has announced that he will call a special session of the Legislature in March to cope with the smog problem plaguing the state.

In his first annual report to the people, Brown said anti-smog legislation "must have top priority in 1960" along with water distribution, education and government reorganization.

**Can't Lose Time**

"We cannot afford to lose a year in the fight to clean up the air," Brown said. "For that reason, I am announcing now that I will call a special session of the Legislature in March of this year."

"In the very near future, I will announce detailed recommendations for the establishment of a motor vehicle exhaust test center and for the installation of automobile exhaust devices approved by the center."

Turning to the water problem, Brown urged voters to support a \$1,750,000,000 bond issue to finance "one of the boldest and most promising peacetime projects ever undertaken."

**Water Supplies**

"Vast additional supplies of water are essential to our expanding urban and industrial needs as well as our agriculture," he explained. "In order that this gigantic project be completed in time, we have already started constructing dams and aqueducts."

In the field of education, Brown said he would ask the Legislature to allocate about \$60 million for new capital construction in state colleges and \$50 million for the University of California.

**Expansion Required**

"The future economy and well-being of our state - and the educational challenge by the Soviets - require we expand our higher educational facilities for all our young people capable and willing to work for a college education," the governor declared.

Brown emphasized that "a fourth responsibility in 1960 must be a tangible start toward the reorganization of our state government. A systematic study of government reorganization has been underway. Its results will shortly be made known."

## Oregon Republican Women Complain Of Being By-Passed

Portland - (UPI) - Oregon's Democratic vice chairman said Wednesday Republican women are complaining because they are being ignored in gubernatorial appointments.

A spokesman for Gov. Mark Hatfield in Salem labeled the claim "ridiculous."

State Rep. Beulah Hand said "every time the governor appoints or considers women for major appointments he goes to the Democratic party. For instance, he replaced Cecilia Galey, Republican, with Emily Logan, Democrat, on the Unemployment Compensation Commission."

**Candidate By-Passed**

Mrs. Hand added, "the governor with much fanfare went to the press announcing that Democratic Senator Jean Lewis would be a fine Multnomah county Circuit Court judge and that he would appoint her to a vacancy - if possible. Now he by-passes avowed woman candidate, Republican Representative Shirley Field, for state treasurer."

Travis Cross, the governor's secretary, replied that "if Republican women have any complaints, they don't go to her (Mrs. Hand)." He said the governor's office did not "know for sure in all cases" whether Democratic or Republican women were being

## Articles Drafted For Newspaper

Portland - (UPI) - James T. Marr, executive secretary of the Oregon AFL-CIO, said Wednesday articles of incorporation have been drafted for a proposed third newspaper in Portland.

The announcement was made following a luncheon meeting Tuesday with officials of about 60 unions.

Marr said plans call for incorporation of the third paper for \$1,250,000 which, he said, would be enough to finance a 24-page paper of 100,000 circulation.

Portland's two present dailies, the Oregon Journal and Oregonian, have been publishing a joint edition since a strike by Stereotypers last Nov. 10.

Marr said the drive for a new paper was "gathering momentum" and that he hoped to have firm commitments for newsprint and printing facilities by the end of this week.
