The Medical Roundup

Don't Give Up Your Job
 I get many letters a week from people who ask me whether, because of someone's hay fever or asthma or emphysema or bronchitis or eczema, it would be advisable for the family to move to the South-west. Often, my feeling is that it would be a poor move for a man of 50. He might find it impossible to get a good job again. I remember a number of able men around 50, or able women around 40 who, because of some annoyance or disagreement with the boss, threw up a good job and then could not find another one. I remember, particularly, an engineer who, in his 50s, threw up his good job when his chief asked him not to leave at that time. The engineer's wife wanted to go to a distant city to be operated on by some famous surgeon she had heard of. When, a month later, the engineer started hunting for a new position, he found all doors closed to him. He was "too old."

I recently read where a survey by the National Office Management Association showed that in Minneapolis only 15 per cent of 109 companies have no maximum age limit in hiring new employees. The most common maximum age is 50, but in some companies it is lower than that. In New York City 42 per cent of 148 companies are said to be closed to men by the time they reach 50, and 68 per cent of the firms will not hire a man who is 55. Women of 45 will find that two out of three firms will not take them. Some companies in San Francisco will not hire a man who is over 40.

Mountain Sheep Hearing Recessed Until Monday
 Salem—UPI—The Oregon Water Resources Board has recessed until Monday morning a hearing on Pacific Northwest Power company's high Mountain Sheep dam. The company finished presenting its direct case with testimony by Milo Bell, fisheries consultant, of Mukilteo, Wash. Other company witnesses were Alton E. Alspaugh, hydro development engineer; power company executive Arthur J. Porter and fish biologist J. A. Roy Hamilton, all of Portland. Monday, the Oregon Fish and Game Commission are expected to cross-examine Bell and Hamilton and present their own case. Fish Interests Opposed PNP wants to build the \$250 million dam on the Snake river near the confluence of the Salmon and Imnaha rivers along the Idaho-Oregon border. The 690-foot arch dam, highest of its type in the nation, would back up waters of the Snake and Imnaha but not the Salmon river. Fishery interests are opposed to the dam. PNP has asked the state of Oregon for a preliminary permit, a step before applying for a state license to build. It also has applied to the Federal Power Commission for a construction license. The Water Resources Board hearing will be followed by a hearing of the Oregon Hydro-electric Commission.

Man Takes Life With Gun Used by Father
 La Puente, Calif.—UPI—Philip P. Marcellian, 58, shot and killed himself Wednesday with the same shotgun his father used to commit suicide 21 years ago, sheriff's deputies reported. Marcellian, who had been ill, left a note to his wife, Alice, 50, which read: "Blame no one. It's for the best this way. No tears please." The victim's brother, Marion, told deputies their father used the same gun to kill himself in 1939.

Gronchi's Illness Poses Problem
 Moscow—UPI—The postponement of President Giovanni Gronchi's visit because of illness left Italian Ambassador Luchio Pietromariti with a problem. What to do with 28 turkeys, 16 mousses de foie gras; 16 pheasants; eight large salmon, numerous boxes of Italian fruit, orchids from Stockholm, 1,000 carnations and 400 roses from Italy? He also has four large cakes which the embassy cook has spent a month preparing. Two depict the Colosseum, and two the Kremlin.
