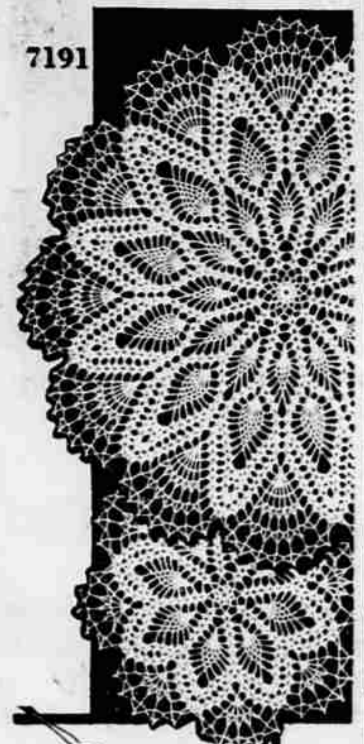


Table Finery

Graff and James, 125 South Central ave., Medford, submitted the apparent low bid of \$47,949 for construction of a sales and warehouse building for the Grange Cooperative in Ashland.

Bids were opened at the office of Marquess and Marquess, Medford consulting engineers.

Other bidders were Wiley company, Ashland, \$51,350; Ausland Construction company, Grants Pass, \$53,990; and James Henson, Central Point, \$62,244.

The building will have tilt-up concrete walls, concrete floor, glued laminated trusses, plywood sheathing and built-up roof. The building will be 74 by 40 feet.
