Negro Democratic Guidance Session Leader Accused Of Gift-Taking

Phoenix—A guidance session covering preparation for college or other training beyond the high school level will be held for students of Phoenix High school Jan. 20 at 1 p.m.

Principal E. M. Skipworth announced that a visiting team from the state system of higher education has been invited to conduct the meeting.

At the meeting, representatives from the state schools will explain their respective academic offerings and point up each institution's requirements, according to Skipworth. He also pointed out that an opportunity for questions by the students will be given to provide individual guidance. Career opportunities, costs, scholarships, a description of "adequate preparation" and mechanics of school application and entrance will be stressed.

The sessions are conducted annually in the high school as part of the regular guidance program. They represent a combined effort by the state system of higher education and the high school to better prepare students for careers, and to inform them of the educational opportunities provided at public expense within the state.

Tighter Laws to Battle Organized Crime Under Study

Washington — FBI — Justice Department officials said today they were drafting legislation to enable the federal government to fight with greater strength against organized crime.

These officials viewed the three-to-five year prison sentences and \$10,000 fines meted out Wednesday in New York to 20 figures of the 1957 gangland convention in Apalachin, N.Y., as the best the government could hope for with the limited weapons at hand.

The 20 men, described by Federal Judge Irving R. Kaufman as having "defied law and order for years," were convicted on a charge of conspiring to obstruct justice by their refusal to tell about the Apalachin gathering. The maximum penalty is five years imprisonment and \$10,000 fine.

In sentencing the men Kaufman said all were "sophisticated, hardened, intelligent" criminals.

Their probation reports, he said, "read like a tale of horrors."

William G. Hundley, chief of the Justice Department's organized crime and racketeering section, said several proposals were being considered to strengthen legal dealing with such elements. He did not disclose what they were, however.

At present, Hundley explained, the federal government's hands are tied in many cases because the "great bulk of criminal violations are not within the purview of the federal government." Murder and other felonies, he noted, are prosecuted by the states.

Hundley pointed out that racketeers with a "reputation" for violence frequently are sent to federal prisons only because of income tax evasion, as in the case of Al Capone, or perjury — not their more serious crimes.
