

Don Carter Challenges in Bowling

Omaha, Neb. — (UPI) — Don Carter, whose comeback heroics are becoming traditional, was in a key position today to win his fifth National All-Star Bowling tournament.

As the last half of the four-day finals opened this afternoon, the blond bomber from St. Louis was in second place just a hair's breadth behind defending champion Billy Welu.

Carter, who staged a major rally to win the World Invitational Bowling tournament at Chicago last month, climbed from 123rd place to make the finals of this tournament.

Then, he started the finals in so-so fashion.

He won nine of his first 20 games and was in 12th place Tuesday. But he was victorious in 10 of the next 12 games and wound up Wednesday's firing just 22 pins behind Welu, who is also from St. Louis.

Welu has won 20 games, lost 11 and tied one while chopping down 6,785 pins for 156 Petersen points and a 10-pin carryover. Carter stood 155-38 on 19 wins, 13 losses and 6,813 pins.

Rogue-Applegate Steelhead Season Starts This Saturday

Portland — (UPI) — The weekly report on fishing conditions prepared by the state game commission said today that the south coastal area probably will be the best this week end for steelhead.

The commission said the north coast areas would be a "hit or miss" proposition with many streams low, cold and clear. The larger streams are the best bets in eastern Oregon.

The weekly report:

SOUTHWEST: South Umpqua is muddy and the North Umpqua is muddy and cold; steelhead success is spotty in the North Umpqua and upper main Umpqua; angling should be poor to fair in Idley, Winchester and Cleveland Rapids areas.

Lower Umpqua is fair; steelheading should be excellent in the Coos and Coquille systems if water conditions are right; striped bass angling is poor.

Chetco, Elk and Sixes should be fair to good.

The Rogue is muddy from Graves Creek but is clear from the mouth of the Applegate to Galice; fair catches are expected.

The season opens for winter steelhead Saturday on the Rogue, exclusive of tributaries, below mouth of Applegate, and also on the Applegate river, exclusive of tributaries.

Although some of its members continued to pine for a revival of the platoon system, college football's coaching fraternity today hailed the liberalized "wild card" substitution rule as "a step in the right direction."

Only Joe Kuharich of Notre Dame publicly accused the NCAA rules committee of being "short-sighted" after it voted Wednesday to permit a single player to enter a game at any time, even while the clock is running. Under the old rule, a single player could be substituted only during a time-out and provided he had not used up his allowed two entries per quarter.

"I personally feel that you are hurting the game by not allowing unlimited substitution," said Kuharich. "It is shortsighted of the rules committee not to make the move now. Eventually it has to come."

May Change Rule Later

By Schwartz w a l d e r of Syracuse indirectly answered the Irish coach by declaring that the new rule "will give coaches a flexibility that will help improve the game" and is "better than the stampeche which would result if unlimited substitution were brought back."

Woody Hayes of Ohio State and Milt Bruhn of Wisconsin admitted they would have favored a return to platoon football but, unlike Kuharich, they apparently agreed that half a loaf is better than none.

"I am somewhat disappointed that they didn't return to platoon football but the action they took is a step in the right direction," Hayes said.

Sees Some Help

"The new rule will help a little but I'd rather have free substitution," Bruhn declared. "It will be similar to last year, but we won't have to worry about the clock now."

Other comment:

Bill Barnes, California — "It will eliminate some coaching from the sidelines . . . and it might make it more exciting, too."

Rip Engle, Penn State: "This should eliminate coaching from the sidelines, but I don't think many coaches will use an errand boy to rush in plays on every down as some pro teams do."

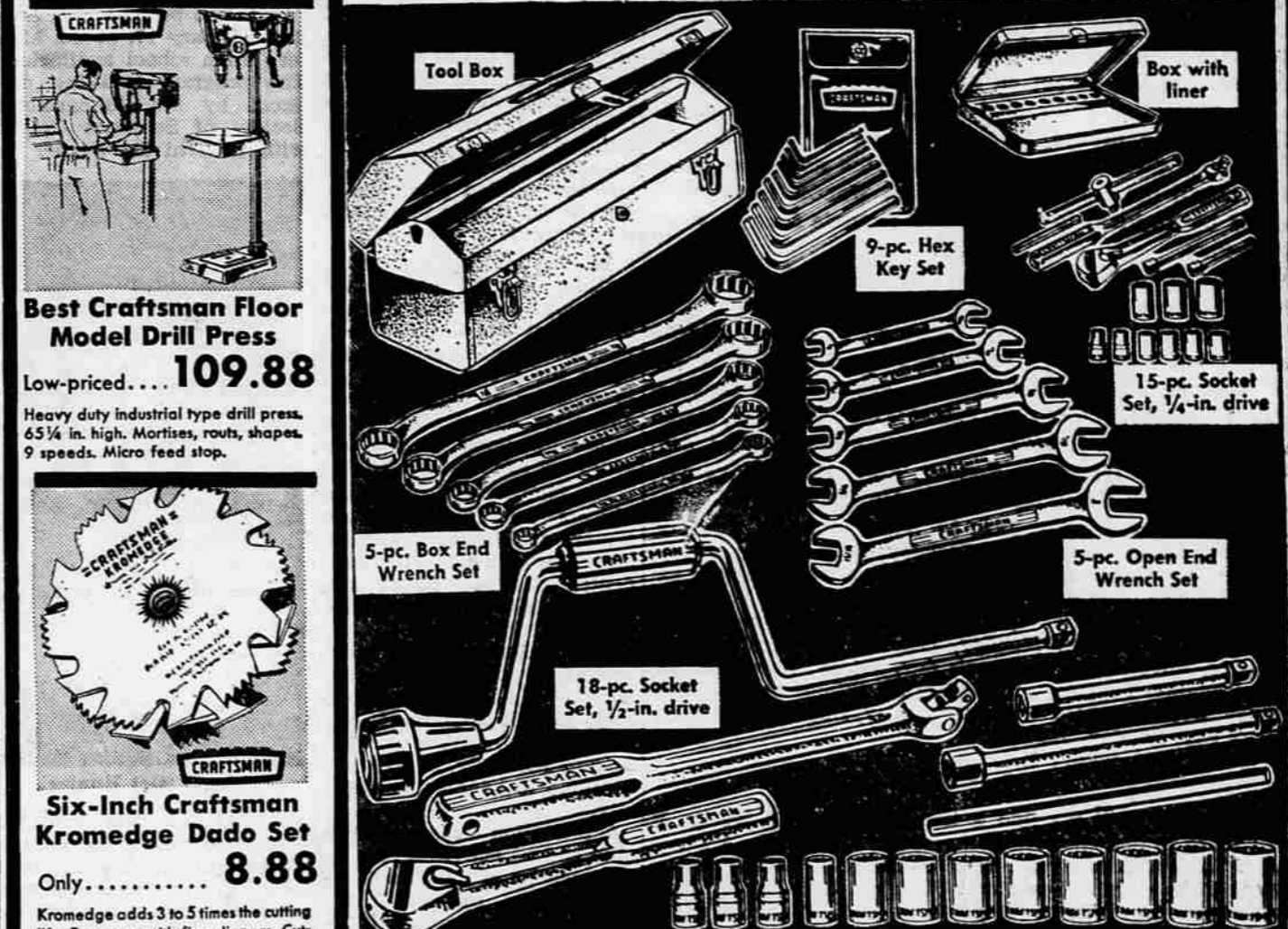
