## Actor to Testify For State in Finch Trial for Murder

Los Angeles—UPI—Actor-director Mark Stevens said today he has volunteered to appear as a prosecution witness in the murder trial of Dr. Bernard Finch and Carole Tregoff.

"I knew Dr. Finch and his wife," said Stevens. "She was a good friend of mine. We played many a game of tennis together."

Stevens, 39, who said Mrs. Barbara Jean Finch, 33, was a "wonderful person," was expected to testify of hearing Mrs. Finch express fear of her husband before she was found shot to death July 18 at the Finch \$65,000 West Covina home. Finch, 42, and his mistress, Miss Tregoff, 23, are accused of the slaying.

Two hoodlums arrived Wednesday night to be on hand Monday along with Stevens to testify for the state. The men were contacted in Las Vegas, Nev., where Finch and Miss Tregoff sought a paid assassin to kill Mrs. Finch, the state claimed.

John P. Cody was brought in custody from a Minnesota jail where he was serving a term on a bad check charge. He already has testified before the grand jury which indicted Finch and Miss Tregoff that the couple paid him \$1,400 to kill Mrs. Finch. The state said Cody never planned to carry out the plot and instead used the money to gamble in Las Vegas.

The other man was Richard A. Keachie who admitted introducing Miss Tregoff to Cody. Keachie currently is free on \$2,500 bail in Nevada on a charge of transporting prostitutes from Minnesota to Las Vegas.

## Half Million Ill In Los Angeles

Los Angeles—UPI—A half-million Los Angeles residents have been stricken in an epidemic of what authorities believe is Asian influenza.

The disease which broke out on a large scale early this week was declared of epidemic proportions Wednesday by acting city health officer Ralph Sachs. He said it would hit its peak in about a week. Dr. Malcolm Merrill, state health officer, said the disease was identified as Asian influenza in patients from San Diego and nearby counties. He said the virus invading Los Angeles was believed to be the same.

The infection causes high temperatures, sore throats, chest and stomach pains—but so far has not been reported to be fatal. It usually runs its course in two to five days.

Firemen received the Robnett and Sims alarms at the same time, about 4:15 p.m. There was also a reported flue fire at Peach st. and Stewart ave. and three fire trucks were dispatched simultaneously. The report from Peach and Stewart was found to be a second alarm on the Beekman blaze.

Washington—UPI—Three gift cattle for Soviet Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev left here Wednesday by an Air Force plane for Moscow. President Eisenhower gave Khrushchev a purebred Aberdeen Angus heifer when the Soviet leader visited here last September.

Tallahassee, Fla.—UPI—The popularity of small foreign and domestic automobiles is costing the state of Florida money, Mrs. Ina Thompson, state motor vehicle commissioner, said Wednesday that although her office sold a record number of license tags last year, revenue from that source did not keep pace with the number of cars. She said the small cars carry \$5 and \$10 license tags compared to \$20 for larger models.

## Rocket Sled Hits 1,990 Mile Speed

Alamogordo, N.M.—UPI—The Air Force announced Wednesday its rocket-propelled sled reached a record speed of 1,990 miles an hour during a one-mile run on rails.

A 3 1/2 ton sled sped the full length of the 35,000 foot track and smashed into a concrete abutment 100 yards beyond the end of the rails after making the record run.

The previous highest speed attained by the rocket sled was 1,925 miles an hour, last June.
