The Medical Roundup

Meniere's Disease
Dr. Yrjo Meurman, of Finland, recently reported that the operation of fenestration in which a little window is made from the middle ear into the inner ear, will abolish vertigo (a sensation of spinning around) in about 80 percent of the patients with Meniere's disease. He got good results in 44 out of 55 patients. In 12 who continued to have vertigo, the intensity and duration of the attacks were generally lessened. It will be interesting to see if similar results are obtained by ear men in this country.

Many persons who are puzzling over the problem of adopting a child could get great help from a recent book by Carl and Helen Doss (Holt). The Doss's have adopted 12 children, and they tell about the questions prospective adopters are asked as to their fitness to raise a child. Many persons who could easily take care of a baby when young, cannot do it very well when they are older. Older people cannot stand so well the loss of sleep at night, the constant need for watchfulness, and the constant turmoil in the house. There are many problems that a couple who plan the adoption of a child should know. Some people have gotten themselves into an awful mess by adopting a "bootleg baby." Later, they were blackmailed by the mother of the child who, perhaps, did everything she could to get the child back. A child should be obtained only through a fine agency. These people investigate the child's heredity and they investigate the competence of the people who want to adopt a child. Very important is the fact that when an agency gives a child to foster parents, the real parents never can find out where the child went. In an appendix to the book there is a digest of the many laws in regard to adoption.

Diagnosis by Computer
There is a note in the Scientific American (September) by Dr. K. Brodman, of Cornell, who 10 years ago advised a medical history questionnaire to be filled out by patients. The results of these questionnaires now have been analyzed by computers, and a correct diagnosis in 44 percent of the cases. Sometimes the computer did a little better job in making a diagnosis than a good physician did!

Space Flight May Provide Data for Heart Disease Fight
Space flight may provide ammunition for the battle against heart disease among persons who never leave the ground, according to an Air Force doctor.

Maj. Cloid D. Green, 38, a former Parker, S.D., physician, said that the idea of soaring into space is the most exciting aspect of the rocket age.

But man's greatest benefits may lie in the medical knowledge that results from exploration of the unknown, he added.

Supervised Capsule
Green is attached to the school of aviation medicine at Brooks Air Force base in San Antonio. He is project officer for "Project Hermes," the space monkey program, and medical officer in charge of simulated altitude chambers.

One of his biggest jobs has been to supervise construction of the space capsule that carried Sam, a 30-month-old monkey, 55 miles above the earth last Dec. 4.

"The final product of this project is going to be increased knowledge to science," Green said. "Putting man into space means merely flying out farther than ever before—hardly an end in itself. The immediate goal is protecting man in outer space—in very high altitude flight.

"There is a lot of value in this program to the public—and not just being able to fly higher and faster than the pilots of another nation."

Green said that findings can be useful in combating heart disease and in testing the performance of the heart under stress.

"It's only been in the last year or two that we've learned anything about the heart and circulatory system from exercise—through the use of better recording instruments."

Centers on Problems
Much of Green's interest centers on problems discovered through the monitoring of an individual's cardio-vascular and respiratory systems during simulated space flight.

The space age does not awe Green. He regards it as merely another important medical job.

"I can't see that this is any different from the airplane age," he said. "It's an extension—with faster motors and equipment that can go higher and faster. The automobile introduced new problems. Airplanes introduced new problems. More powerful craft will introduce new problems.

"I doubt it's as big a jump to contemplate space travel today as it was to contemplate the steam engine at the time it was developed."

Thornton Rules on Construction Wages

Salem—UPI—Attorney General Robert Y. Thornton said Wednesday that laborers on construction projects of drainage districts, irrigation districts and district improvement companies must be paid "the prevailing rate of wage."

He said a 1959 law provides that workers on such projects are to be paid not less than other workers in the locality, and that a written statement certifying the hourly wage rate must be filed according to the state labor commissioner's regulations.

The opinion was requested by Labor Commissioner Norman O. Nilssen.
