**Parks Commission Suggests Engine Remain in Location**

The Jackson park locomotive will remain where it is if the city council approves last night's recommendation of the Medford parks and recreation commission.  
By a five to one vote the commission recommended to the council that the locomotive remain on its present position on McAndrews rd. in the northwest corner of the park.  
The possibility of moving the locomotive to another location came up when several residents on McAndrews rd., immediately across from the engine, complained that it obstructed the view from the front of their homes.  
A committee, appointed by the commission last month to investigate the complaints, gave its report to the commission last night. Final action on the location of the locomotive will be taken by the city council, probably at next Thursday night's meeting.  
**Favorable Recommendation**  
In making the favorable recommendation, the commission pointed out that the location of the locomotive, which was donated to the city by Medford Corporation, had been publicized prior to its actual installation, and the parks and recreation commission had passed favorably on the location at a public meeting and no opposition was voiced at that time.  
Several commission members said it would probably have been to the city's advantage if the residents of the area had been contacted individually before the engine was placed so that any complaints they might have had would have been voiced at that time.  
Russ Jamison, commission chairman, said it would be a good idea even now if the commission would contact the complaining residents and explain to them the city's position and show them how the park would look when completed.  
**Artist's Sketch**  
An artist's sketch of how Jackson park will appear when landscaped and completed, was displayed, and it was pointed out that within three years there would be a screening of trees or shrubs between the locomotive and the street.  
Several pictures of the view of the engine from the front porches of the complaining residents were taken by the park department and presented to the commission so they would have an idea of just what it looked like from the homes.  
It was admitted by some members that it looked rather bad now, but when the rest of the park was completed it would look much better. It was also pointed out that the engine looked much better than the buildings of the Jackson county housing authority that used to be there.  
**Against Recommendation**  
Mrs. O. A. Eden voted against the recommendation because she felt the residents were right in that the locomotive was wrongly placed and obstructed their view.  
The commission said that a fence had recently been placed between the locomotive and McAndrews rd. so there would be no danger of children running into the street.  
Since there had been some complaints concerning the nuisance that children playing on the locomotive would cause surrounding neighbors, the parks and recreation department took a survey of the number of children playing on the locomotive and found that in periodic checks over a six-week period, there were no more than four children playing on the engine at any one time.

**Civil Service Law Savings Described**  
Salem — (UPI) — A county can save money by putting the question of a county civil service law to a vote of the people by the referral method, which does not require a voters' pamphlet, according to Attorney General Robert Y. Thornton.  
The opinion was requested by Avery W. Thompson, Douglas county district attorney. Thornton said, however, the referral method cannot be used to supersede the initiative method where the initiative method has been undertaken and completed.  
The last Legislature passed an amendment which authorizes counties with a population of less than 300,000 to adopt a county civil service law by vote of the people.
