**By UNITED PRESS INTERNATIONAL**  
Washington - Sen. John F. Kennedy, Democratic presidential hopeful, alluding in a speech to a recent controversy over parts played by his father and Vice President Richard M. Nixon in settlement of the steel strike:  
"I would have brought my father today, but he's out in Chicago settling the railroad strike."

San Antonio, Tex. - Lorenzo McCall, who refused to testify against a cohort in a narcotics case:  
"I refuse to testify on the ground that might trend (sic) to intimidate (sic) me."

Washington - Sen. Mike Mansfield, Democratic whip, saying that the United States should take the question of Russian missile tests in the Pacific to the United Nations:  
"I must respectfully suggest that in my opinion the Russian action, coming as it does in the interim before the first summit conference, is provocative."

Miami - Robert M. Bader, Miami attorney who served a term in a reformatory as a boy for car theft and now campaigns to cure juvenile delinquency:  
"I'm not proud that I was in reform school, but I'm grateful for the experience."

### Parking Program OK'd in Portland

Portland - UPI - Downtown Portland Inc., Thursday night approved a \$21,512,000 off-street parking program for the downtown area.  
The plan would be financed by revenue bonds, issued by the city and secured by a special assessment district which takes in the entire downtown area.

Edgar W. Smith, president of the group, said this was the first step in a plan to revitalize the area.

The program calls for construction of nine parking garages for short-time parkers. Practically all major office buildings, department stores and facilities would be within two blocks of one of the garages.

### Francis Files for Attorney General

He seeks the Republican nomination.  
Present attorney general is Robert Y. Thornton, a Democrat.

Francis, an attorney, has served in the Legislature since 1943. His ballot statement is "equal justice for all."

Francis was an unsuccessful candidate for attorney general four years ago against Thornton.

Eugene - David W. Gault, son of Mr. and Mrs. Howard Gault, box 541, Medford, has been initiated into Arnold Air Society, honorary for advanced Air Force students at the University of Oregon.

Eight other outstanding junior and senior Air Force cadets have been taken into the organization. Gault is a senior majoring in acting.

### Panama Freighter Sinks in Pacific

Otaru, Japan - UPI - The 8,000-ton Panamanian freighter Gambler sank in the Pacific Thursday 690 miles southeast of Hokkaido but all 30 crewmen and officers were picked up safely by an ocean-going rescue tug, the Japan coast guard reported today.

Lloyd's Registry does not list any vessel named Gambler.

According to the coast guard, the freighter was taking a cargo of 8,500 tons of scrap from San Pedro, Calif., to Kobe, Japan, when it ran low on fuel Jan. 7.

Drifting helplessly in heavy seas, it began taking on water and flashed a distress signal. The 1,200-ton tug Cambrian Salvor sped from Yokosuka and reached the Gambler on Jan. 10.

Swope said the committee represents "a cross section of Oregon union members and officers who believe Senator Kennedy is the best qualified candidate to lead the Democratic party's continuing fight for social justice for the working people of our nation."
