Ear Noises and Dizziness

Letters constantly keep pouring in on me from people, usually old people, who are distressed because of ear noises - perhaps associated with dizziness, and rarely some nausea, or even vomiting.

All I can do is to tell them, first, to go to an ear man to see if the trouble is in the ear or in the brain. Usually, in the cases of older people, the ear doctor will say, "There is nothing wrong with your ears, and hence there is nothing I can do for you." Often, when I see elderly people, all I have to do is ask them, "At the beginning of this trouble did you have a terrible dizzy spell, in which you almost lost your sense of balance, or perhaps got woozy, frightened, a bit nauseated, and perhaps thought you were having a stroke?"

Often the patient says, "Yes, I had exactly that, and I was afraid I was having a stroke." What I think, then, was that the person did have what I call a little stroke, which is due to the plugging-in of a little artery in the brain. Naturally, I can't open up the artery, and hence I can't give quick relief. About all I can hope for is that the patient's trouble will clear away with time, as it sometimes does. Many of these unhappy people - people living on a small income - will say, "Should I take all my savings, and go to some Clinic or some specialist somewhere?" And my answer is, "No; I wouldn't do that. I do not know of anyone who knows how to cure what you have."

Extrastyles

Extrastyles are little extra beats of the heart. Often they appear to be thrown in by a nervous impulse. Usually, the extra beat is so weak that the person doesn't feel it; what he feels is the big strong beat that follows it. This beat is usually powerful because, after the little beat, the heart had a fraction of a second in which to rest. The important point is that when a doctor examines a patient's heart, and gets an electrocardiogram made, and finds nothing wrong with the heart muscle, he can say to the patient with extrastyles, "I learn to get used to them. They may keep coming, off and on, for the next 30 or 40 years. They do not need any treatment. There is a medicine that sometimes stops them, but it can do harm." The big thing for the patient to do is not to worry about the thumps he feels in his neck or his chest. Extrastyles do not constitute a danger to the person's life.

Harold J. - I can never trust her again.

Cynthia J. - I am miserable in my marriage because of a mistake I made two years ago. My husband won't forgive me for it.

We had been married three years and were about to have a child when Harold confessed to me that he had become involved with a married woman in his office. He said the attraction was just physical and it would wear off soon, but that he couldn't help himself at the time.

I was so upset that I went straight to the woman's husband and told him. He took her to another city at once. Since then my husband throws this up to me every day. He stays out late and admits he dates others because he says he misses the other woman and can't feel the same about me anymore. Must I pay the rest of my life?

Harold J. - The craziest Cynthia did was what Cynthia did was the craziest thing. This woman's husband was the violently jealous type and he might have killed both of us. Our affair surely would have blown over in a short time if Cynthia had just kept her mouth shut.

Now I find I can't put this other woman out of my mind. I am restless all the time and find myself looking for women who resemble her. I hate to go home. I feel I can't talk to my wife because she's so real friend to me. I would like to confide in her but know I can never trust her again.

Cynthia just made trouble for us by what she did. The way it looks now I'll never get over this obsession. I would like to forget about it.

but you can't control things like this so easily.

The Council—it is an unfortunate fact that mental sickness can be contagious when a person sensitive to the particular disease is exposed to it for a long period.

Cynthia is probably of reasonably sound mind, yet the fact that her husband has managed to convince her that she and not he is the wronged party in their marriage indicates that his irrationality has conquered her completely. This situation is not as extraordinary as it may sound. There are many similar cases in the records of psychiatrists and social workers.

Cynthia should recognize that her behavior was in no way wrong. It was not necessarily the only way of dealing with such a situation, yet it worked out well in this case - as far as it went.

The next step might have been to rebuild this marriage on a new basis, but this requires outside help with a man like Harold. His problems are very serious indeed. His refusal to see this makes things harder.

Harold has a fundamentally distorted picture of the marriage relationship. Apparently he sees his wife as a mother rather than a mate. He wants to come to his "mother," confess his wrong doings and get forgiveness or punishment. But he resents the power that this woman holds over him and he is cruel to her in retaliation. He can easily torment her by exciting her jealousy.

This is Harold's real "obsession" and the quicker he recognizes it the greater will be his chance to live a normal married life. He is badly in need of help and we suggest that he consult a clergyman or family service organization as a start. Cynthia will probably also need some help to regain a normal outlook on marriage. She should bear in mind that she made no mistake and cannot possibly be considered a disloyal wife.

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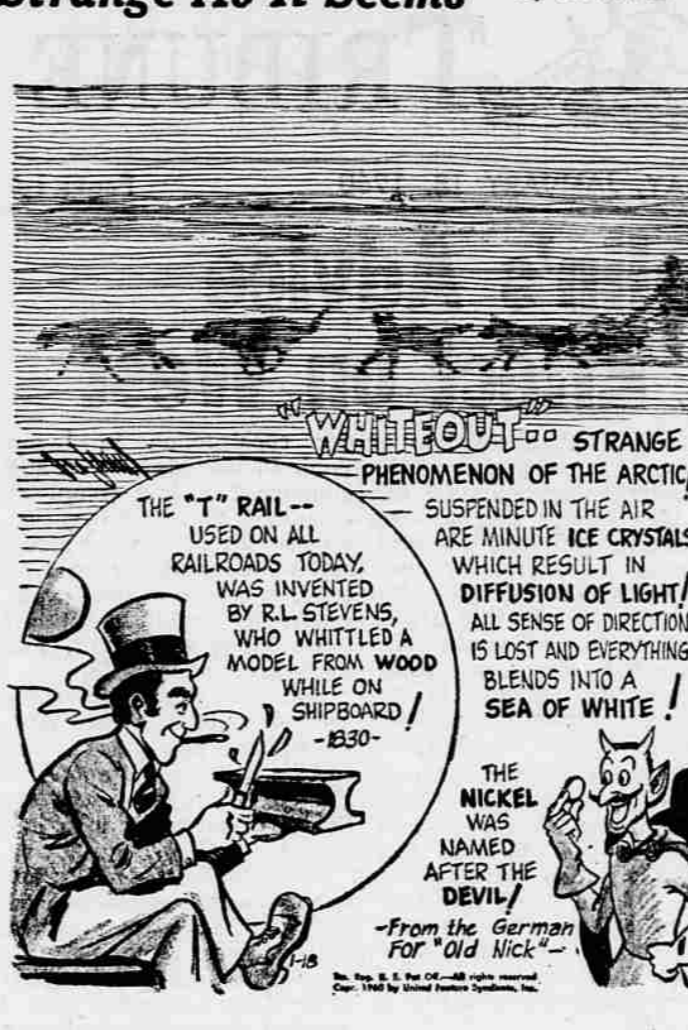
BIG LAND OWNER
