

### Wall Street Chatter

New York—(UPI)—Look for a thaw in the tight money picture later this year, says Prentice-Hall.

A slowdown in the pace of business—once stockpiling and consumer purchases reach their peak—will ease money demands, the firm points out in its weekly report on business.

Further, the anticipated breather in the stock market will result in substantial switches from equities to debt investments, it notes.

"Another turn in the screw toward easier money is seen in the anticipated 1961 federal budget surplus. And if the surplus is used for debt retirement . . . The government would be releasing money rather than bidding for it."
