**The Lessening Fear Of Radiation**

Of late, there have been so many frightening articles about radiation that people have written me to say that they no longer will allow their dentist to x-ray their teeth. This seems to me quite unjustifiable. Through most of the old leaders in the use of x-rays in this country have been my close friends. One of them, the late Dr. Walter B. Cannon of Harvard, was the first man—in 1896—to x-ray the digestive tract. Not knowing then that the rays were dangerous, he produced changes in the skin of his wrists and knees, but I doubt if his life was at all shortened by this heavy exposure to radiation. Several of the pioneers in x-ray work had the skin of their hands badly changed, but by having someone remove the little wart-like patches that occasionally started to become cancerous, they lived into their 60's and 70's. I have known intimately a number of x-ray men who, in a huge clinic, had much exposure to x-rays as, each day in the dark room, they "screened" the stomachs and colons of from 30 to 50 patients. None of them suffered from any disease that could be ascribed to their exposure to x-rays.

**One of Four Klamath Timber Units Get Bid**

Klamath Falls—UPI—Only one of four sustained-yield timber units of the Klamath Indian reservation received an actual bid at the opening here this week.

Crown-Zellerbach Co., Portland, submitted an offer of \$1,642,182 for the Antelope desert unit. This bid was \$6,000 more than the set minimum price. It consists of 91,541 acres, most of it in lodgepole pine.

There were no bids on the Sycan unit composed of 61,611 acres.

Plan Approved

On the other two units, the Specialty Gas Products Company of San Francisco presented a sustained-yield management plan which has been approved and requested an extension to April 20 for bidding. Those two units are the North Marsh unit, which carries a minimum price tag of \$1,047,376, and the Modoc Point unit, priced at \$3,784,618.

Earle Wilcox, sales management officer, returned from Washington, D. C. for the sale and said that there will be three additional units sold on April 1.
