Seattle - (UP) - The University of Washington Huskies, led by Bill Hanson and Clint Names, defeated the Oregon Ducks, 63-56, in a non-conference basketball game here Friday night.

Hanson, hitting 11 out of 16 shots from the field, had 23 points, while Names got 17 before fouling out.

Neck Pain Shackles Williams

United Press International Boston - (UP) - Doctors at famed Lahey clinic hunted in vain four hours Saturday for the pain in the neck of that has shackled Boston Red Sox hitting star Ted Williams.

The search was so extensive it prevented the 41-year-old slugger from conferring with Boston General Manager Stanley (Bucky) Harris over Ted's 1960 plans and, possibly, a contract.

Red Sox trainer Jack Fadden served as spokesman on the examination and reported that Williams was in "better condition now than at the close of last season."

For the first time in his long and stellar career, Williams' batting average plunged below the .300 level in 1959 as he struggled against the neck ailment that was attributed to everything from a pinched shoulder nerve to a tooth infection.

Next Fight Easier Says Pender

Boston - (UP) - Rangy, black-haired Paul Pender, who earned \$23,300 while capturing Sugar Ray Robinson's disputed middleweight crown, said Saturday he expects to win more easily over Ray in their return April fight, and "to get a lot more money for it."

Pender, at his suburban home in Brookline (Mass.), wore a white patch over the five-stitch cut on his left brow. He said, "this will be healed in plenty of time for me to do six weeks training for the fight."

Robinson, who'll receive about \$85,580 as a consolation for losing the New York and Massachusetts version of the 160-pound title in Friday night's fight, was still disappointed with the upset split decision but he was not protesting.

Venturi Leads in Tournament

Pebble Beach, Calif. - (UP) - San Francisco Ken Venturi took a two-stroke lead after three rounds in the Bing Crosby golf tournament Saturday with a 54-hole score of 209.

Venturi posted nines of 35-33 for a 68 at the Cypress Point course mid-way in the day. Then he sweated out some erratic shot-making by a half-dozen men who had a chance to catch him but failed.

Gene Littler, the first day co-leader from San Diego, had the best crack at it. Four-under par with a 33 on the first nine at Cypress, Gene faded in the back stretch and came in with a 71 for a 211 - good for second place.

Mike Souchak, who had started the day in first place, blew to a 77 on the Pebble Beach layout when his putter failed him. He three-putted two greens. He also got what he called "an impossible lie" in a trap and wasted two shots there.

Missouri Ends Loss Streak

Columbia, Mo. - (UP) - The Missouri Tigers ended a two-game losing streak by thumping the Tulsa Hurricanes 84-74 here Saturday night.

The Bengals shot 56 per cent for the game with only one player, sub-Walt Grebing, shooting less than 50 per cent. He took only one shot.

The win gave Missouri an 8-7 record for the season and was its sixth victory at home against one loss.
