### Jacksonville Tree Farm Subject of Article

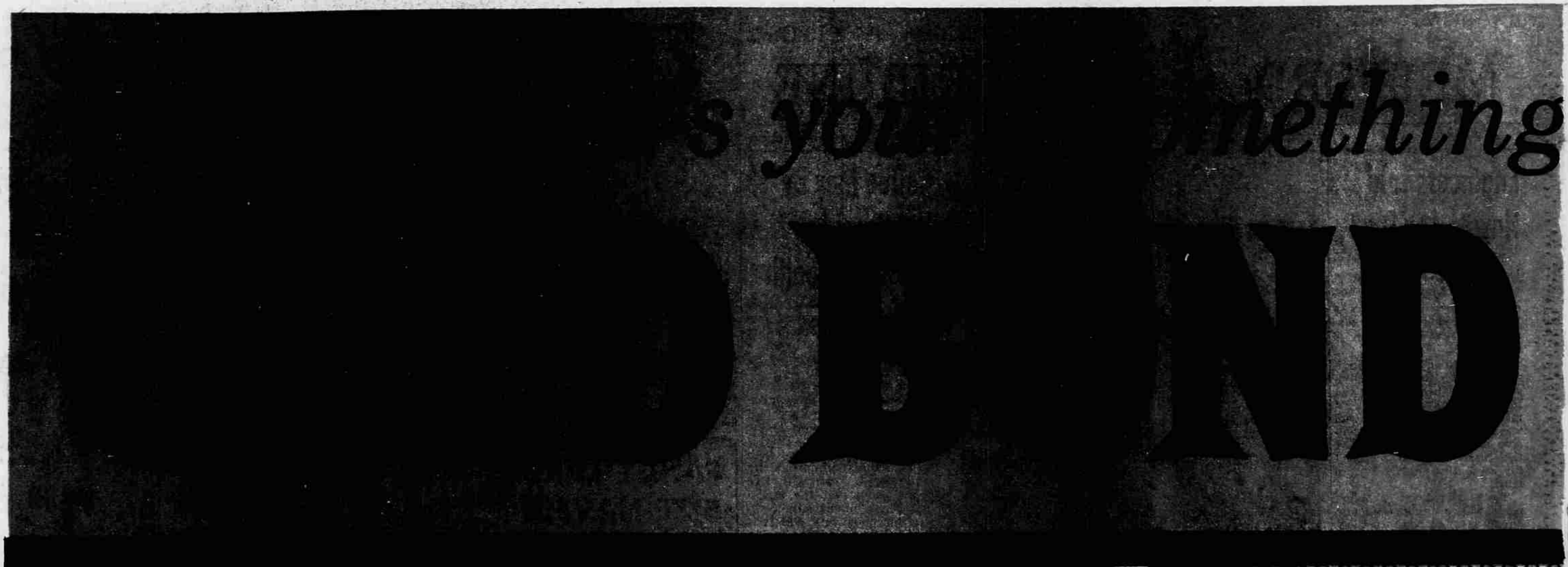
