

'Good Thrasing' Given West German

Berlin (UPI)—A West Berlin Jew took Chancellor Konrad Adenauer's advice and gave an anti-Semite a "good thrashing."

The Jew hit Heinz Weil, 33-year-old salesman, with a bar stool when Weil called him a "Jewish lout," West Berlin police reported.

No charges were preferred against the Jew but police ordered Weil's interrogation.

Police gave Weil a blood test to see if he was drunk and then sent him home. He was believed to have a broken jaw.

The Jew acted on advice given by Adenauer in a speech to give a good thrashing on the spot to persons committing anti-Jewish acts.

The Jew's name was not disclosed.

EXTEND TRADE PACT

New Delhi (UPI)—The government of India has agreed to extend its trade agreement with Communist North Viet Nam for two more years, it was announced Sunday. The agreement was originally signed in 1956 for a three-year period.

Wall Street Chatter

New York (UPI)—The old axiom—"a bull makes money, a bear makes money; but a hog never makes money"—is quoted in the current issue of Forbes magazine.

"I continue to believe that the market is high and it will be difficult to make gains in 1960 enjoyed during the last two or three years," writes J. Donald Goodwin of Forbes.

While it is entirely possible that the Dow Jones industrial could advance to 700 or higher in the months ahead, and that selected stocks will make new highs, Goodwin took the view that investors should exercise extreme caution in making new selections and "change the gears in their thinking."

Standard & Poor's Corp. believes the stock of Dana Corp. is worthy of holding and that Eaton Manufacturing represents an attractive commitment.

Chemical sales this year are estimated as high as 28 billion dollars by the Manufacturing Chemists' Association, a study of the situation by Smith, Barney & Co., shows. Sales in 1959 will approach or pass 25 billion dollars making it a 7 per cent increase over the previous record of \$23,418,000,000 set in 1957—a significant gain in view of the prolonged steel strike, the firm points out.

Portland Man Leaves For MacArthur Dinner

Portland (UPI)—O. E. Walsh, vice-president of Portland General Electric, left Sunday evening for New York where he will join with others Tuesday in the birthday anniversary dinner for Gen. Douglas MacArthur.

Walsh is a retired brigadier general and was on MacArthur's staff in World War II.

Police Chief Robert Ingram said the thieves gained entrance by breaking out a window and then prying the office door open. He said the job of punching the safe dial appeared to be a "professional" one.

New books and added copies are being added to the Public Library of Medford and Jackson County at an accelerated rate.

A total of 1,098 books were added in December, of which 1,007 were adult and 91 juvenile. Of these, 441 were paperback editions. The increase was handled by the introduction of streamlined processing for paperback fiction and certain kinds of hard cover fiction, such as mystery, westerns, and science fiction.

In a quality survey of the books in Oregon libraries, our public library rated high in the fields of childrens books, notable fiction and non-fiction, reference books and periodicals. The library was low in science, rock and missiles, and child care and development. Efforts are under way to strengthen the weak areas. The need for science and technology knowledge is imperative in our age.

Action Started to Dissolve Companies

New York (UPI)—New York State Attorney General Louis J. Lefkowitz today began action to dissolve Floyd Patterson Enterprises Ltd. and Teleprompter Corporation.

Lefkowitz sought orders in state Supreme Court to permit him to take action against the two corporations. He charged that the two companies had violated state anti-trust law by combining to monopolize the promotion of heavyweight championship fights.

The action by the attorney general resulted from his investigation of the promotional aspects of last June's heavyweight title fight between Floyd Patterson and Ingemar Johansson.

Lefkowitz said he also will institute antitrust proceedings against individuals and firms involved in the alleged conspiracy.

Fire Destroys Old Buildings in Idaho

Wallace, Ida. (UPI)—Fire early Sunday destroyed the last of the old wooden buildings in the downtown business district of this northern Idaho mining town.

Destroyed in the blaze were two barber shops, an unused cafe and a bar. No injuries were reported.

Brick buildings on either side of the burned area received only smoke and water damage.

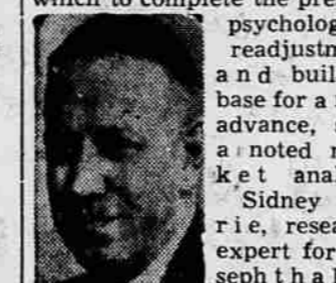

Time Will Heal Stock Market, According To Noted Analyst

NEW YORK (UPI)—Time will heal the stock market—time in which to complete the present psychological readjustment and build a base for a new advance, says a noted market analyst.



Sidney Lurie, research expert for Josephthal & Good Market Years

"This is not another 1957—when we were bearish because business was in danger of collapsing.

"To the best of my knowledge, no bull market ever ended in January. Furthermore, election years are good market years. Also, unlike the situation a year ago new securities are not tapping demand."

The records show that since 1900, the market has risen in 10 presidential election years and declined in five.

The declines came in 1916 when Wilson was elected for a second term; in 1920 when Harding was elected; in 1932 and 1940 when Franklin Roosevelt was elected; and 1948 when Truman was elected.

Wall streeters note, however, that presidential election years produce some wide market movements as the election approaches and the street tries to discount the successful candidate.

Time Will Heal Stock Market, According To Noted Analyst

He cites the past half dozen election years:
"1936—Stock market near a top break in 1937.
"1940—A dragging, getting nowhere market.
"1944—Sideways fluctuations.
"1948—Drooping fluctuations.
"1952—Drifting market.
"1956—Sideways at the top break came in 1957."

From a public-psychology viewpoint, I think this year of 1960 will be found lacking in stimulus, which, in turn, results in the loss of momentum, he says.

Forecasts Becoming Popular
Neill, noted for his contrary opinions, notes that it is becoming popular to forecast "a surge to 800 and above in Dow - Jones industrial average."

Such predictions, he adds, always offer contrary correlations — "big investors will slide out as the little fellow

rushes in. Result: Move never reaches its destination."

"If you go by the maxim that human nature never changes, the final blow-off to the 10-year bull market will witness a public scramble for stocks reminiscent of other Wall street manias, he observes and then launches into contrary opinion.

Important Market Tops
He cites statistics to show that there have been important stock market tops which were not accompanied by frenzied public speculation, and concludes:
"If you take into consideration the margin requirements today 90 per cent and also the vast absorption of the public's investments and speculations in mutual funds, it seems to me that you have an argument against the assurance—or even the probability—that the end of the bull market will see wild speculation and 5-to-6 million-share days.

"Indeed, who knows that the 10-year bull market will end in a blast? Perhaps we'll witness other 'immediate' setbacks like 1957 and 1958."
