Dunedin, Fla. (UPI)—The youngest of the elderly resumed play today in the 21st annual PGA Seniors golf tournament.

The 50-54 age bracket went into its second round after the older age groups, from 55 on past 80, wound up their second round Thursday. The scores were all in favor of the "youngsters."

Al Watrous of Birmingham, Mich., a three-time winner, won the Alfred Bouine Trophy by finishing tops in the 55 and older brackets after 36 holes.

The 60-year-old Watrous won the trophy in a sudden-death play-off with four others.

The favorites, however, those in the 50-54 bracket, teed off for second rounds today led by a couple of 68s posted in first-round play by Charlie Sheppard of Highland Park, Ill., and Duke Gibson of Kansas City, Mo.
