Linfield to Offer Five Fellowships

McMinnville - Linfield college, in conjunction with Oregon State college at Corvallis, has been authorized to award five national defense graduate fellowships in physics under the national defense act of 1958.

The fellowships are to enable qualified students to pursue graduate study leading to a doctoral degree in physics as a preparation for college or university teaching.

The Linfield-OSC program involves one year of full-time graduate study at Linfield followed by two years at OSC.

No Enthusiasm To Indicate Strong Market In February

New York - The stock market was supposed to rise in January. Instead it fell flat on its face. It's supposed to fall in February. Instead, it may rise.

That's the way Wall Street talks just now. But there isn't too much enthusiasm to indicate the market will continue strong through the month.

However, market men know that the market never does what it's supposed to do. Also that each operation is different from the one which pre-

ceded. Hence, there's no saying that because the market did this or that this year, it will repeat itself next year.

There will be no holiday on Feb. 12-Friday—since Lincoln's Birthday has been discontinued as a stock exchange holiday. The Washington Birthday holiday falls on a Monday which makes that week have a three-day week end.

Measured by dollars the market fell \$24.8 billion in January. In the first two days of February it regained \$7 billion of the loss.

Falls To Follow
Last year while the Industrial average rose 19.85 points in January and February, the Standard & Poor's 500-stock index rose only 0.20 point. That meant the other parts of the market failed to follow the industrial rise.

The 1959 market early in the year saw a rise in the blue chips. During January of this year, that group was the hardest hit.
