Robertson Balloons Record Cincinnati Wins 123-74

United Press International—And still more records for Oscar Robertson: Cincinnati's fabulous Big O would have been excused a letdown following his record-breaking week end but there was simply no holding him Monday night when he poured

in 62 points in a 123-74 victory over North Texas State. The total ballooned his all-time major college point record to 2,662 and marked the biggest single night of his career.

In addition to breaking his previous personal high of 56

points, Robertson smashed the old Cincinnati Field House mark of 50 points in one game and also broke Bob Kurland's 14-year-old Missouri Valley conference record of 58 points.

The 6-foot, 5-inch whiz hit on 23 of 29 shots from the field for a .793 percentage and made 16 of 19 free throws for .842. Early in the game he scored nine straight field goals and during a six-minute stretch of the second half he made 10 straight field goals and a foul for 21 points. The second-ranked Bearcats opened up a 55-32 lead at halftime and rolled it up in the second half as they continually fed the ball to Robertson.

Cincinnati's 18th victory in 19 games highlighted a night during which 5 of the nation's other top 11 teams won.

Third-ranked Bradley rolled over Houston, 78-57; fourth-ranked Ohio State remained unbeaten in the Big 10 with a 106-69 rout of Wisconsin; fifth-ranked West Virginia ripped New York university, 98-69; eighth-ranked Georgia Tech downed Louisiana State, 76-56, and 11th-ranked North Carolina beat Clemson, 73-54.

Also in the Big 10, Michigan State handed Illinois its third conference loss, 78-77, Purdue beat Michigan 79-65, Indiana whipped Iowa, 87-74, and Northwestern rallied for a 62-61 win over Minnesota.

In other top games, 13th-ranked St. Louis won 73-59 over Oklahoma City; Kentucky whipped Mississippi State, 90-59; Auburn routed Florida, 89-51; Alabama ripped Georgia, 64-60; Oklahoma beat Nebraska, 63-54, Texas defeated Texas Tech, 75-66, and Colorado beat Oklahoma State, 48-40.

TRIPLE FOR ROTZ

After it defeated Willamette 81-78 at McMinnville Saturday night to make their season's record 7-1, Willamette now is 6-2.

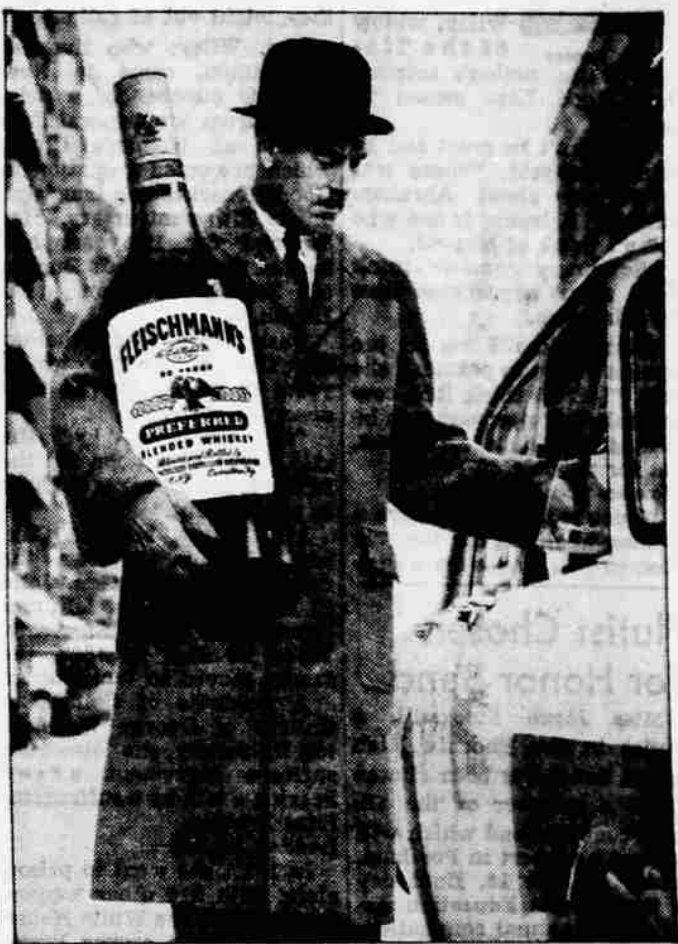
Moyer Increases Title Bout Offer

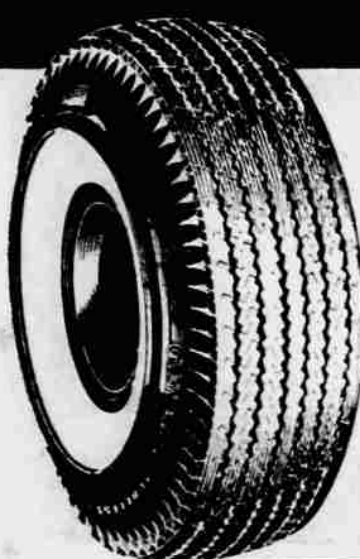
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
