Portland—UPI—Dyrol Burleson, ace Oregon miler, Wednesday night was named Oregon's athlete of the year at the 12th annual Hayward Banquet of Champions.

Fred Spiegelberg, who coached the Medford football team to the state A-1 championship last year, was named as man of the year in Oregon sports.

A crowd of about 600 attended the banquet which featured Jack Hurley, fight promoter and manager, as featured speaker.
