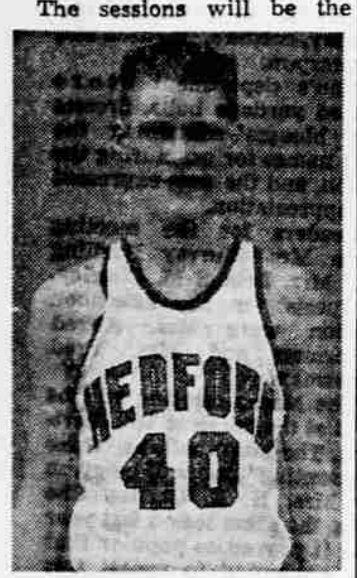


Tornado, Grizzlies Collide at Ashland; GP Coming Saturday

Crater Entertains Klamath on Friday

Central Point—The Crater high Comets have given a lot of attention to rebounding work this week. And, there's good reason.

The Comet cagers play Klamath Falls on Friday evening at Central Point. Klamath has the tallest aggregation and Crater the shortest in the Southern Oregon conference.

Game time will be shortly after 8 p.m. after a 6:30 p.m. junior varsity opener.

Crater will be out to do just a bit better than it did the last time it met the Pelicans here. The Comets led in that January game at the end of every quarter but tired and finally yielded to the superior height and depth and sharper second half shooting of the Klamath club.

While the Central Point club lost 42 to 36 in that skirmish, it showed that it could give an interesting battle and stiff challenge to a team now rated No. 5 in United Press International's Oregon prep rating poll. Klamath won a later game from the Comets 97 to 61 at Klamath Falls. The Comets

felt they played well enough in that fracas to win in most cases but the Pels were too torrid in their shooting on the occasion.

Crater, with upset in mind, has its hopes bolstered by its victory last week end over Grants Pass, which on the following night gave the Pelicans a spirited run before falling behind in the fourth quarter.

Coach Lloyd Hoffine of Crater may have Earl Cooper, Chuck Turner, Dennis Edwards, Dave Sharp and Tom White in the Crater starting five. Klamath tutor Dean White may pick from among Gary Pezke, Bruce Erickner, Paul Bishop, Dean Dunsen, Steve Binney and Fred Biehn.

Injury Suffered By Chamberlain

An injury to scoring ace Wilt Chamberlain has the Philadelphia Warriors hurtling all over today.

"We're just going to have to wait on the doctor's report before we know when or how much he can play," said General Manager Eddie Gottlieb after Chamberlain was knocked out of Wednesday night's 125-117 loss to the New York Knickerbockers at Madison Square Garden. "All we know now is that he was pretty well shaken up."

Chamberlain, the 7-foot, 2-inch whiz who snapped the National Basketball Association's single-season scoring record Tuesday night, was injured when accidentally struck in the mouth by New York forward Willie Naulls' elbow. Wilt fuzzily took the two free throws coming to him but then retired from the game just before the end of the first period after scoring five points.

Tom Heinsohn and Bill Sharman scored 28 points each as the Boston Celtics whipped the Detroit Pistons, 153-121, and Cliff Hagan tallied 39 points and Clyde Lovellette had 31 to lead the Hawks to a 120-110 win over the Cincinnati Royals in other games. It was Cincinnati's 14th straight loss.

BOXER NOT SURPRISED
Miami Beach, Fla.—(UPI)—Louis Rodriguez surprised everyone but himself Wednesday night when he scored a fourth round knockout over Carl Hubbard of Philadelphia in a nationally-televised bout at Convention Hall. The 23-year-old Rodriguez, top-ranked welterweight contender from Camaguey, Cuba, had drawn jibes from critics who said he failed to show any punching power in his previous appearances in the United States.
