Roseburg Board OKs Rebuilding

Roseburg - (UPI) - The Roseburg Urban Renewal Board has approved recommendations of a 70-member advisory council to get on with the rebuilding of blast-shattered downtown Roseburg.

The advisory council Wednesday night said the city could not wait for a federal decision about restoring the downtown area destroyed in a dynamite-truck explosion last year.

Chairman Ralph De Moisey said, "we are convinced that we can rebuild and modernize our own community better and faster without help from the Federal government."

The board also approved a low-level bridge over the North Umpqua river which would make rebuilding of the downtown area easier.

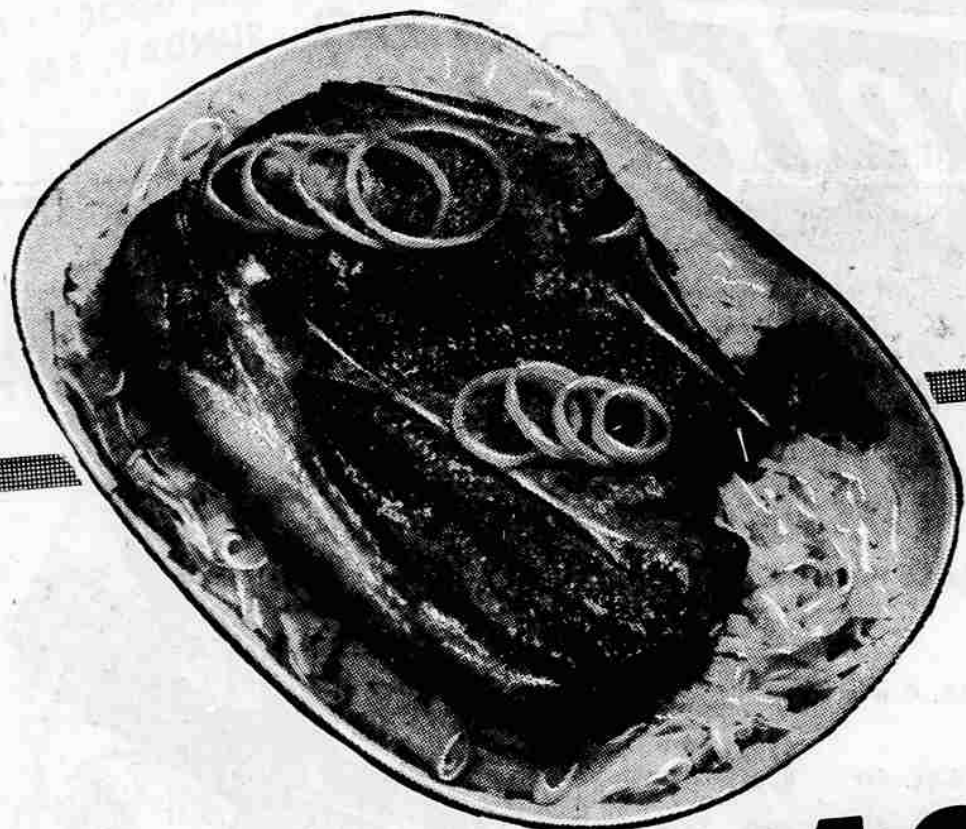
