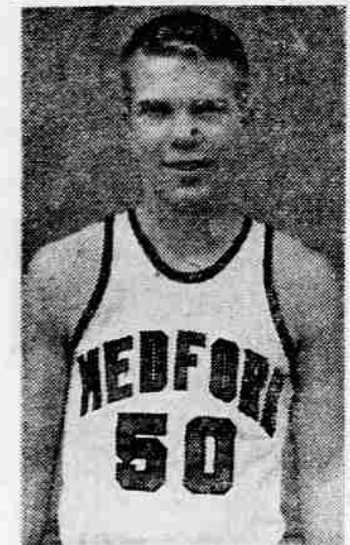

Black Tornado Has Ashland, GP Scraps

Medford high's basketball team, No. 2 rated in Oregon prepdom, puts its undefeated Southern Oregon conference record up to test twice this week end in games that carry it to the three-quarters mark of District 6 A-1 competition.

Ashland's Grizzlies are hosts to the Black Tornado this evening with the Medford crew rated heavily favored against the cellar team. Medford is also the choice on Saturday against Grants Pass at Hedrick gymnasium here.

Opportunity to cinch a state tournament berth will spark the Tornado aggregation. Ashland, of course, still is bidding for its first 1960 victory in the circuit. And GP's Cavemen yet have memories of the scare they gave the Medfordites in the last meeting of the teams. Medford holds two victories over each, scored in the first half of district play.

Cavemen Concentrate

Grants Pass, with just the single game this week end, can put its concentration on the Medford brush. Ashland, like Medford, has two games in as many nights and takes on Klamath Falls on Saturday on the Pelican floor.

Medford's Lowell Dean missed yesterday's workout because of a touch of flu. Coach Frank Roelandt said that Bob Quinney might start in Dean's place tonight with Jerry Shults, Jerry Anderson, Dick Ragsdale and Ken Durkee rounding out the opening five. He reported, however, that Booth Deakins has been looking good in drills and might be in the starting crew.

For Ashland, Coach Earl Iba may choose from among Phil Tucker, Jerry Hauck, Dave Jackson, Bob Hardy, Harley Dickerson, Steve Gray and Doug Forrester.

Grants Pass had three players ailing this week but expected to have two of them back and ready for the Medford engagement. Ron Erickson, Dan McIntire and Gary Hugoboom all missed Monday and Tuesday workouts of the Cavemen.

Erickson's absence from the squad may last a week and a half. He had a lung condition and was advised by a doctor to get as much rest as possible this week. Hugoboom has had shin splint trouble and McIntire suffered a bad cut over the eye in a collision with a player while getting some "extra" basketball practice on Sunday.

Coach Gordon Prehm will select his starters from among Rex Benner, Larry Janssen, Clyde Murray, Jim Purkett, Hugoboom and McIntire.

First Baptist Senior Quint Stays Unbeaten

First Baptist kept its record clear in the men's church basketball league last night with its fifth win of the campaign.

Olympic Downhill Run Fast

Squaw Valley, Calif.—(UPI)—The men's Olympic downhill will be opened to practice today for the first time, and the lightning-fast condition of the run promised impressive times—and probably impressive spills.

Officials and workmen have been packing the course since the snow storm ended last Tuesday, and Thursday they allowed the downhill men to ski down Squaw Peak alongside the course. After studying the terrain, they were impressed—and worried. Clearly it is a true champion's test.

"The course is very difficult on the upper half, and surprisingly flat on the lower half, which makes extremely important," said Anderl Molterer, Austrian star.

For today's opening practice, officials warned the course would be "very fast"—so fast that only expert skiers among the hundreds of newsmen and photographers will be allowed above Tower 20, party way up the course.

Linfield, OTI Slight Crucials

United Press International College basketball interest in Oregon this week end centers around games involving Linfield and Oregon Tech.

Oregon and Oregon State have the week end off. They're getting ready for next week when they each play Washington and Southern California at home.

Linfield, which holds a narrow half-game lead in the Northwest Conference race over Willamette, travels to Portland tonight to meet improving Lewis and Clark.

Saturday night the same two teams play at McMinnville.

Willamette, meanwhile, is expected to pick up a pair of victories in a home-and-home series with Pacific. The latter now has lost 29 straight over two seasons. Other Northwest Conference action sends College of Idaho to Whitman for a weekend pair.
