The Medical Roundup

Early Training For the Deaf Child
A mother writes to tell me of the Association for the Pre-School Deaf, Inc., of 4335 Union Street, Flushing, N. Y. She says that her little girl started at an auditor training at 10 months. At 18 months she wore one hearing aid, and at 24 months she wore two hearing aids, one in each ear. As the mother says, experts say that the earlier a child is trained to hear or helped to hear, the better. The child then is more likely to learn to speak well. This stands to reason, because unless a child can hear what is said, he or she cannot very well learn to speak normally. On the West Coast there is the John Tracy School for the Deaf (806 West Adams Blvd., Los Angeles, Calif.) They have a correspondence course for mothers who very much want to help their deaf child, but who live far away from a school.

New Antibiotics
At a recent symposium on antibiotics, held in Washington, D.C., a number of very promising new drugs were described. For instance, there is now a synthetic penicillin that can be taken by mouth, which works well, and will kill some of the germs which, of late have been giving much trouble to doctors and patients. A new antibiotic has been found to be a better weapon against pneumonia, infections of the urinary tract, infectious skin diseases, and dysentery due to germs. Another new antibiotic appears to be a good treatment for the acute diarrheas of infancy, and another is proving very effective in cases of gonorrhea. According to the chemists reporting at the conference, over 500 new penicillins

have been synthesized in the last seven months, which is a remarkable achievement. The great drug houses are doing a magnificent job. **Muscle Diseases**
Hundreds of people a year ask me where on earth they can find someone really interested in the study of the rare muscular paralyses. I read now that The Institute for Muscle Diseases (515 East 71st St., New York 21, N.Y.) is finishing an 11-story building which will be staffed by some 150 scientific workers. The operating budget will be about \$1,500,000 a year. Dr. Ade T. Milhorat is the director.

Park Use Sets Record in State
Salem — A record 517,061 campers used Oregon state park overnight facilities during 1959, according to C. H. Armstrong, state parks superintendent. Interest in overnight camping has increased tremendously since the first camps were attended by but 44,000 people in 1952, Armstrong said. "Existing facilities are being enlarged where needed to take care of the 1960 season", he pointed out. Willowa Lake Park in northeastern Oregon, one of the state's most heavily used areas, will have 33 new camp sites this year; Detroit Lake Park on highway Oregon 22 between Salem and Bend will have 30 additional sites; and, Harris Beach near Brookings in southwest Oregon will feature an additional 41 camp sites. Umpqua Lighthouse Park overnight camp near Winchester Bay, which was not completed in time for the '59 season, has already been enlarged in anticipation of the heavy use it will receive after all job situation.

Mikoyan To Leave For Home Saturday
Havana—UPI—Soviet Deputy Premier Anastas Mikoyan returns from the provinces today to appear on television before he leaves for home Saturday. Before his late-night appearance, Mikoyan is expected at two cocktail parties—one given by the Foreign Ministry, the other by the National Association of Industrialists. Mikoyan has been touring Cuba by helicopter with Premier Fidel Castro during the past four days.
