Police Chores Due To Increase

Gladstone—UPI—Attorney General Robert Y. Thornton told the Gladstone Kiwanis club Thursday night that Oregon law enforcement agencies will face heavier responsibilities in the coming decade.

One of the factors, he said, is an expected increase in Oregon's population by 25 per cent in the next 15 years with a 40 per cent concentration of the state's people in Portland and fringe areas.

He said an increase in the number of juveniles in proportion to the general population will require additional

police and juvenile officers. Unless salaries of law enforcement officers are tied to the cost of living, he said, inflation will hit police and sheriff's offices by driving trained personnel to better employment.

Thornton said the high cost of living also will directly contribute to higher crime rates by forcing more mothers to leave the home to seek outside employment.

The attorney general estimated that crime now costs every family in Oregon about \$500 a year.

Ex-Medford Lawyer Appointed To Harney

Salem—UPI—Gov. Mark Hatfield Thursday appointed Irving C. Allen, an assistant attorney general, to succeed William J. Crawford as Harney county district attorney.

Crawford is resigning to return to private law practice in Portland.

Allen, who takes over March 1, has practiced law in Portland, Medford and Seaside.

Search Pressed For Adolph Coors

Golden, Colo.—UPI—Authorities pressed their search today for two or three men wanted for questioning in connection with the suspected kidnaping of brewery millionaire Adolph Coors III.

Sheriff Art Wermuth said two or three men were seen parked on a road near Coors' ranch home south of Golden for about an hour Monday, the day before Coors disappeared.

There was no indication the Coors family had received a demand for ransom. The sheriff said he believed

Coors was alive and held captive, "maybe in Denver." Coors, 44, board chairman of Adolph Coors company at Golden and eldest son of one of the nation's wealthiest brewing families, has been missing since Tuesday morning.

He left his ranch home at 8 a.m. for the brewery, 10 miles north of Golden, driving a truck. Coors apparently got no further than a bridge over Turkey creek, two miles from his ranch.

The truck, its motor still running, was found at the bridge approach.
