Hatfield Says Dedication To Moral Issues Needed

Spokane-UP - Oregon Governor Mark O. Hatfield said Saturday materialism and "dollars themselves" will not save the country and called for dedication to moral principles.

Speaking at an overflow Lincoln day gathering, the 38-year-old Hatfield said survival of the country against totalitarian assault depends on its stand on moral issues, its spirit, and its dedication.

"We are on a moral campaign," he said, "and our purpose is moral vitality. We will have to stand up and be counted for our moral positions."

Commenting on the administration's missile program, the youthful-looking governor said he was "surprised to see so many political authorities, although most of them are more political than authoritative."

"The President can better evaluate the situation," he said, adding that he himself was not an authority.

Hatfield said he believed Adlai Stevenson would get the Democratic nomination for the presidency, though he said he thought Lyndon Johnson would be a tougher opponent for Richard Nixon, whom Hatfield said will get the GOP nod.

He also lashed out at weaknesses in welfare programs, which he said in many cases made it more profitable for a person to stay on welfare than to work.

Two Projects OK'd At Sauvies Island

Washington-UP - The Chief of Army Engineers has authorized two emergency projects at Sauvies Island near Portland to repair damage caused last June by wave action from Canadian Naval vessels, the office of Sen. Richard L. Neuberger said Saturday.

The damage was caused when the Canadian vessels were en route to Portland for the Rose Festival.

Sen. Neuberger said the Army Engineers told him the projects were designed to alleviate the threat of levee breaching or destruction.

"The meeting will start Engineering Week activities for the local section," according to President R. L. Adams, Myrtle Creek. "This is an annual activity centered around Washington's birthday and

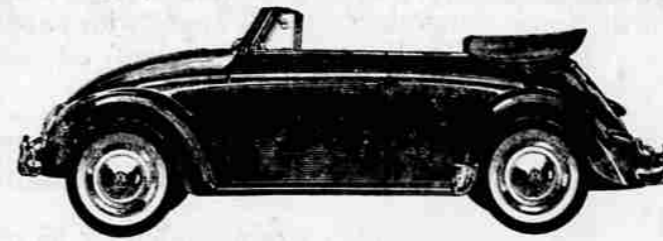
