# Glen Cunningham is still winning victories

*He overcame a childhood tragedy to become  
a great track star; now he's dedicated to imparting that  
faith and courage to other American youngsters*

**T**WENTY-FIVE years ago the name of Glen Cunningham was on the sport pages of every newspaper in the country. He was our greatest track athlete, the first American to approach the magic four-minute mile.

There was more to his story than running prowess. When he was eight, Glen's legs were burned so badly in a school fire that doctors said he would never walk again. But stubborn courage and unlimited faith enabled Glen to conquer this infirmity and walk—and then run.

Today Glen is 51, tall and slim and in perfect physical condition. And he is a man with a mission. He has never forgotten the rewards of his fight to walk, and he is telling thousands of children that they, too, can solve their problems if they have courage and faith.

From September to April, he lectures school children and church and civic groups on this subject. In the summer, children from all parts of the country are nonpaying guests of Glen and his wife on their 840-acre ranch in the Flint Hills of Kansas, near the town of Cedar Point.

The children all have one thing in common. They need help. Some are physically handicapped and find inspiration in Glen's own struggle. Some are emotionally disturbed "problem children" in need of loving guidance. Others are pale and in poor health. All find something of what they need at Glen's ranch.

When a youngster arrives, he has the feeling he is entering the gates of a zoo. Deer, buffalo, African sheep, and wild animals from throughout the world are in corrals or pastures. Peacocks strut majestically, and kangaroos hop around to get a look at the visitors.

Why so many animals? "To help any child, you first must get him interested in something," Cunningham explains. "What's better than animals? The affinity between children and animals is amazing. Boys come here who have never worked and brag that they never will. Almost at once they are intrigued by the animals and, in a day or two, they are carrying water and food to them. In a week, they accept the strict routine of the ranch without protest."
