Neuberger Wants Device for Autos

Washington - UP - Sen. Richard L. Neuberger said Saturday the automobile industry should equip all new car models with a new device that reduces unburned hydrocarbon in the exhaust.

The Oregon Democrat noted that manufacturers said the device will be standard equipment on all 1961 cars sold in California and will be offered as optional equipment for those sold elsewhere.

"Experts estimate that the device could be included on a new car at a cost of less than one dollar," Neuberger said in a statement.

Rogue Marine Plans New Building Here

A new building with a semi-modern look is planned for Rogue Marine just north of the Rogue Valley State bank on Court st. Mel Johnson, store manager, has announced.

The concrete block building construction will start some time this week and be completed in 30 to 45 days, Johnson said. This will shift the quarters of the boating and marine supplies business from its present location with Walker The Weeper Trailer sales on South Riverside ave.

The new building will triple the space now available for Rogue Marine to a total of 1,200 square feet of floor space. A grand opening for the new quarters will be held April 2, or a week after the Boat Show scheduled for March 26 and 27 in Medford.

Norwalk, Conn.-UP - Alexander R. Stavenitz, 59, former director of the Federal Art Project, died at his home here Thursday night.

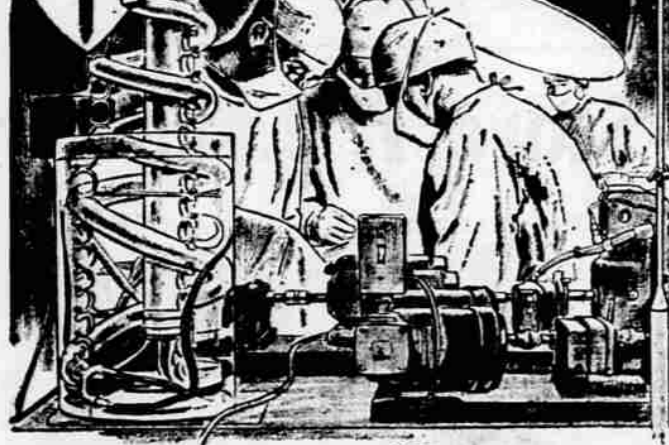
