**The Medical Roundup**

**The Many Fears People Have** I often marvel at the many unjustified fears that many worrisome people get. I wish

now that through the years I had kept a list of all the weird questions that people ask me. For instance; many people fear that a cancer should be caught perhaps from Aunt Betty who recently had her breast operated on. No cancer is not catching. Other people are afraid their children will catch tuberculosis from the healthy child of a healthy man who once was in a sanatorium. That, of course, is a silly fear.

Hundreds of thousands of people are afraid to swallow the little bit of mucus that goes down from the back of the nose into the throat. They should swallow it; it won't do them any harm. It is not a sign of a bad sinusitis.

More hundreds of thousands of people are sure that the tiny trace of aluminum that one can get from cooking in aluminum pots will poison them. This is so silly, because aluminum is not a poison. When a man gets a stomach ulcer his doctor is likely to give him in a year pounds of a "cream" made of aluminum.

**Won't Produce Cancer**  
Of late, many people have written wondering if the swallowing of a bit of paraffin from a paper milk carton would produce cancer. It certainly wouldn't. Perhaps millions of people think it would be a tragedy accidentally to swallow a few small pieces of broken glass. Actually, I remember a woman who, when going insane, one night broke her water glass; chewed it up and swallowed the pieces. Her mouth and gullet were cut and bleeding, but during the next week, nothing happened, and she remained physically well.

Several people have written to ask anxiously if the plastic in their glasses' frame or in their false teeth will cause cancer. I am sure it won't. Some write to know if they or their children can catch any disease from their dog or cat. If the animal is healthy, I doubt if they need be fearful. They might do well to ask their veterinary doctor to check on this point. If I were to buy a parakeet, I would want to be sure that it was not suffering from parrot fever—which it could give to me.

**Added To Comfort**  
During each summer, many women become very fearful of air-conditioning, but I am sure they are wrong. The modern cooling of air in homes, stores, offices, restaurants and trains has added enormously to the comfort and efficiency of men and women.

Many persons are very fearful of sleeping-tablets. They accept the statement of some persons that they are habit-forming as morphine. In all my 50 years of practice, I have seen some highly neurotic and undisciplined persons who started to take sleeping-tablets by the half-dozen—both day and night—but I never have seen habituation like that to morphine. I have known thousands of people who took sleeping-tablets for many years and never felt any desire for them or any desire to run up the dose. All they wanted from a tablet was a night's sleep, and that was all they ever got. They never got any "kick."

**Really Do Harm**  
Many persons worry about missing heart beats, but they

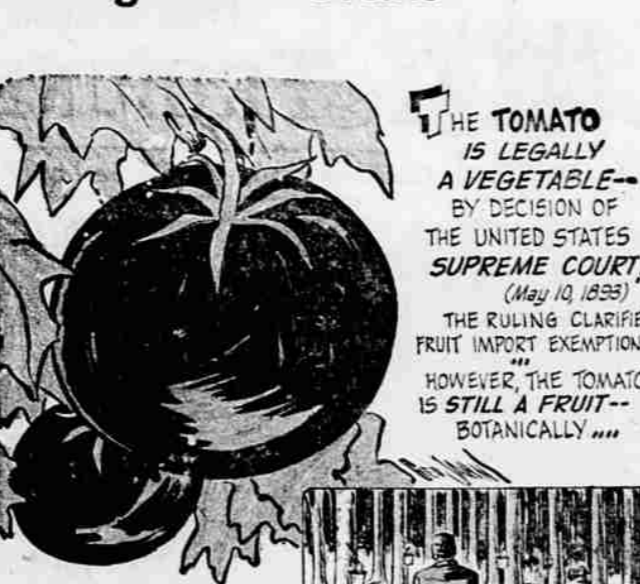
