Valley Volliers hold the lead in the Medford YMCA volleyball tournament after two weeks of action.

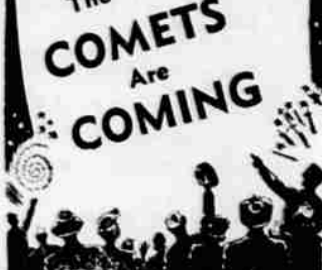
