Tuberculosis of the Spine

In a Child

The parents of a child with tuberculosis that has destroyed one of the vertebrae in the spine want to know how the child got this infection.

I, too, usually, when a doctor studies the family of such a child, he will find some one in the home who has a chronic cough, due to an old smoldering tuberculosis.

Many people have a tuberculosis which will neither kill the victim nor quite get well. Sometimes, one of the grandparents in a home has a tuberculosis of the lungs which lay dormant (sleeping) for many years, and then become active again. I have known children who caught tuberculosis from

such a grandparent. Some died quickly from a tuberculous meningitis. What is sad is that so often the old person accepts his chronic cough as one of the annoyances of old age, and never goes to see a doctor about it. Sometimes, also, when he consults a doctor, tuberculosis is not thought of, and hence is not looked for. No person with active tuberculosis should live in a home where there are children. In most communities, a person of limited means who has a pulmonary tuberculosis can go to a municipal sanatorium.

Hemorrhoids and Cancer

People want to know if hemorrhoids will ever turn into cancer, or if the removal of the hemorrhoids will cause cancer. Actually, hemorrhoids have nothing to do with cancer; they never turn into cancer, and their removal will not cause cancer. Here is the important point. Many a man has died of cancer of the rectum because someone assumed that, because he had bleeding hemorrhoids (piles) that was all he had. The doctor removed the hemorrhoids — and this is hard to believe — he did not look up into the man's rectum with an electrically-lighted tube. If he had, he would have seen a cancer two or three inches farther up the bowel from the hemorrhoids.

Every so often I see a person past 50 who has been bleeding from the rectum. His doctor sends him for an x-ray study and when the x-ray may says he saw nothing, everybody is satisfied. Actually, an x-ray study cannot be counted on to show a flat, shallow, cancerous ulceration in the rectum.

Because of this, I know an able x-ray man who, in order never to deceive the trusting doctors, who send him work, always looks into the rectum and the so-called sigmoid loop just above it with an electrically-lighted tube, before he x-rays the colon. He is so afraid that the doctor won't do this — as he should.

I'll never forget seeing, in consultation, a prominent man of 65 who had been examined by a young physician friend of mine. The doctor thought he had done a perfect job of examining the man, and had told him that there was nothing wrong with him. As I looked through the reports of all the tests, I said, "But I see that nobody examined the rectum, either with his finger, or a lighted tube. The old man had not had the complete examination which he had asked for, and had thought he had gotten." I looked into his rectum, and there were three beginning cancers, each as big as the end of my thumb. Fortunately, they were in such an early stage that an expert promptly destroyed them with very hot electric sparks.

Punishment Meted To Fit the Crime

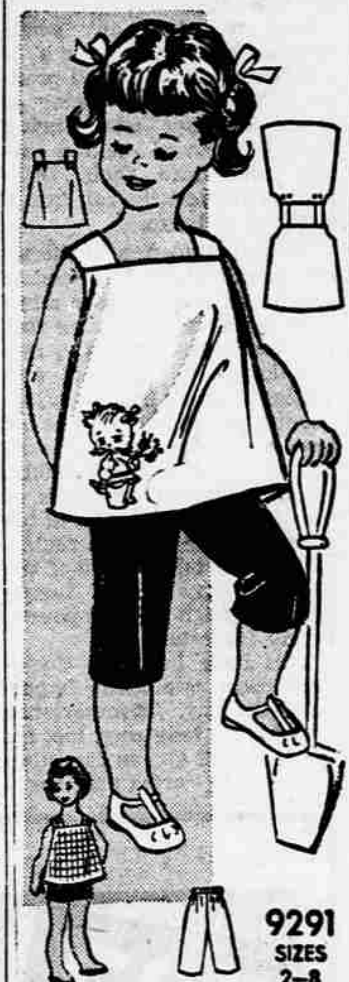
Arrest Amuses Police Officers

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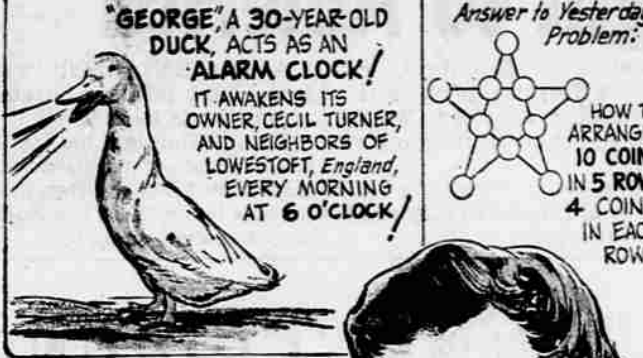
