

Stocks Move Up on Increased Volume

New York—(UPI)—Stocks rose substantially today on increased volume.

The better gains came in issues mainly outside those used to compile the averages, particularly the electronics. General Time rose more than 2 and Beckman, Varian Associates, Ampex, Transiron and Litton all tacked on around a point in this group.

The blue chips featured 2 point gains in Eastman Kodak and Johns-Manville, and gains of around a point in Owens-Illinois, American Telephone, Du Pont, International Nickel, and American Tobacco.

Some Brazilians Disillusioned By Eisenhower's Speech in Rio

Rio de Janeiro—(UPI)—Brazilian political leaders today generally hailed President Eisenhower's speech before a joint session of congress but some were disillusioned because they believed he did not commit the United States to a more dynamic Pan American policy.

The speech, interrupted 22 times by stormy applause, was the highlight of a day in which Eisenhower received the most triumphant welcome ever accorded a visiting statesman here—a day in which

carnival minded Rio greeted him with cheers, fireworks, confetti and song.

In his speech, Eisenhower promised to devote savings on disarmament to a Pan American plan of mutual economic development. He also said the United States would consider "intervention" if any nation, whether by invasion, coercion or subversion, succeeded in denying freedom of choice to the people of any of our sister republics.

It was a warning to all Communists to keep their hands off Latin America but did not spell out what steps

the United States would take.

Alfonso Arinos, member of the opposition Democratic Social Union (UDN), and president of the Senate Foreign Relations committee, called the speech "of great importance to us due to his assurance to American determination to defend democratic freedoms and the principle of self determination."

Expectations Not Met

Deputy Osvaldo Lima, House leader of the Partido Trabalhista Brasileiro (PTB), which is a member of the government coalition, said Eisenhower's expression of friendship and sympathy was "superb" but he added:

"The talk did not meet our expectations for a new concept of Pan Americanism and a new United States policy for Brazil and Latin America."

Aurelio Viana, Socialist leader in the House, called the speech "satisfactory" but declined further comment.

House Votes To Uphold Veto of Pollution Bill

Washington—(UPI)—The House today upheld President Eisenhower's veto of a Democratic bill to boost federal spending to combat pollution of rivers, streams and lakes.

The vote to override was 249-157, 22 votes short of the required two-thirds. Voting to override were 234 Democrats and 15 Republicans. Of those who voted to sustain, 130 were Republicans and 27 Democrats.

To Become Issue

The roll call vote killed the first major bill passed by the election-year Congress. Democrats vowed they would make it a live grass roots issue in this year's election campaign.

Democratic House leaders had conceded in advance they had almost no chance of mustering the two-thirds vote necessary to override the veto. But they believed that a direct challenge to the President on water pollution would help their party in next November's elections.

Meanwhile, Sen. Harry F. Byrd (D-Va.) said he feared the Senate would pass a "strong" civil rights bill that would be a "humiliation" to the South. Byrd said in a prepared speech that the South particularly opposed a section of the administration proposal which would declare the Supreme Court's desegregation decisions the "supreme law of the land."

Carole Tregoff's Lawyer Suggests Finch Guilty

Los Angeles—(UPI)—Carole Tregoff's attorneys opened a possible escape hatch for the red-haired former model today by suggesting her lover might have murdered his wife.

In the first overt split in the defense in the trial of Dr. R. Bernard Finch, 42, and Miss Tregoff, 23, her attorneys indicated it was possible for a person to be at the scene of a crime yet innocent of any complicity.

The startling tactic also intimated Carole is going to try to swim even if "Bernie" sinks for the killing of his wife, Mrs. Barbara Finch.

Lawyers for the mistress of the surgeon resume their closing arguments today and it was expected they would further disassociate their client from the man who says he still wants to marry her—"if she will have me."

Prosecutor Clifford Crail had just completed a blistering windup Wednesday when Miss Tregoff's lawyer made his move. Crail said Finch had confessed his guilt by fleeing the death scene July 18. He said that Carole had "aided and abetted him."

Robert Neeb Jr., former partner of Jerry Giesler, started out in dull fashion with a discussion of the legal aspects of the case. Then he took on the subject of "aiding and abetting" and sprung the biggest surprise of the 2 1/2 month trial.

"In all the testimony and evidence," Neeb said, "there isn't one single proof that Carole on the night of July 18 caused any injury, struck anyone, used any weapon, pushed anybody, or touched anyone—certainly not Mrs. Finch."

Neeb gave Finch another indirect kick when he told the jury that fleeing the scene of a crime could be partial admission of guilt. But Miss Tregoff, he said, went voluntarily to authorities even though she was charged with "conspiracy to murder" in hiring convict John Patrick Cody.

Most Cars Stolen By Youths Under 18

Portland—(UPI)—Most of the cars stolen in this country are taken by youths under 18, the head of the local FBI office said Wednesday.

Joseph E. Thornton told a group of law enforcement officers attending a conference on auto theft here that 68 per cent of the auto thefts in this country involve boys or girls 18 or younger.

He said more than 290,000 cars were stolen last year. About 96 per cent of these were recovered, he said.

Tank Used to Break Up Seige on Berserk Mountaineer's Home; Four Persons Die

Chalkhill, Pa.—(UPI)—A National Guard tank late Wednesday broke a day-long seige on a berserk mountaineer's bungalow and state police bullets killed the rifleman who had slain four persons and wounded five.

A volley of slugs cut down Daniel Raymond after he crawled from a basement window of the barricaded home from which he shot down his victims and held off troopers and armed volunteers.

Raymond's wife, who had fled the home with their three children, watched from a neighbor's home nearby as her husband fired on passers-by and finally was killed in the tank-spearheaded final assault.

Used Rifle and Shotgun

Alternately using a rifle and shotgun, Raymond killed:—William Burd, 49, Farmington, Pa., a state Highways Department employee, who was gunned down in the cab of his cinder truck.

—Mrs. Mary Frances Sisler, 61, Ohiopyle, Pa., and Mrs. Edna Maes, 53, Ohiopyle, wife of a Baptist minister, who were riding together.

—Mrs. May Maust, 20, Farmington, who was riding in an automobile with her husband and two young children.

Others Wounded

Mrs. Maust's husband, Carl, 23, and the youngsters, Mary Ann, 2, and Edward, 1, were wounded by a shotgun blast

that preceded the rifle shot that killed Mrs. Maust. The father and children, bleeding and terrified, lay in their automobile in the line of fire for almost eight hours before the seige of Raymond's home ended. Maust is in poor condition at Uniontown hospital. The children are listed as fair.

Harry Cromwell, 45, Ohiopyle, a bus driver, was shot in his car by another blast

from Raymond's shotgun Cromwell, who was en route to Pittsburgh for plastic surgery for a facial injury, was struck in the face, neck and shoulder with the shotgun pellets.

The last to feel the sting of Raymond's bullets was Lawrence Swenglish Jr., 18, Uniontown, Pa. Swenglish was shot through the eye when he attempted to crawl to Burd's aid. His condition is good.

Hatfield Warns Republican Party

Salt Lake City—(UPI)—Oregon Gov. Mark Hatfield warned Wednesday night the Republican party should not permit itself to be placed on the defensive because it has only one active candidate for the presidential nomination.

Hatfield asserted the GOP is "not sterile in leadership" but has in Vice President Richard Nixon a superior and experienced candidate. The

Oregon governor addressed a Republican Lincoln-Washington day banquet attended by about 1,800 party members.

He defended the administration's emphasis on foreign aid as an instrument of foreign policy and defense and criticized some Democratic leaders for demanding cuts in foreign aid to make more money available for missiles.
