When to Suspect Cancer of the Lung

Cancer of the lung is four times more common in men than in women, and it is found usually in heavy smokers. One reason why so many men with cancer of the lung are found to have a tumor too big to get out surgically is that, for a long time, they assumed that their morning cough was due purely to their cigarette smoking. Doubtless, to start with, it was a cigarette cough. The mistake the man made was in not realizing that a cancer can grow for perhaps a year without making the cough much worse. Because of this fact, every heavy smoker with a cigarette cough ought to have his lungs x-rayed at least twice a year. Every so often now I see a man with a bad cigarette cough who listened to his wife and went to get his lungs x-rayed, only when his cough had gotten more than usually bothersome, or when one day he had brought up a little blood, or when, one day, he had gotten to wheezing. Then a good-sized tumor was found, and it was too late to get it all out.

More Children Need Polio Vaccine

I recently read a report from Washington to the effect that of the 87 million Amer-

icans who have had at least one injection of Salk polio vaccine, 68 million have had three or more injections; but the Public Health Service is still greatly concerned over the fact that 4.5 million children under five years of age have not had even one inoculation. It is this group of unvaccinated children which make it possible for us still, each summer, to have big and serious epidemics of polio. As Dr. Leroy Burney, our Surgeon-General, says, a tremendous amount of experience with the new oral vaccine has been accumulated now in several parts of the world, where millions of children have each swallowed a dose of the material. As yet "no evidence has been reported that any of these vaccines harm the persons inoculated." Dr. Burney hopes that within two years the new oral vaccine can be licensed for use in this country.

Club Feet in the House

Many people who have a child with club feet have wondered if the disease could be inherited. In some cases the family will remember that an uncle or someone had had club feet. Often, when there is a little doubt about the inheritance of a disease all one has to do is turn to the breeders of animals and they will tell us all we need to know.

For instance, there are many animals that suffer from epilepsy, and in them the disease can be shown very clearly to follow the usual laws of hereditary transmission. In the July-August number of the Journal of Heredity is the description of a race of club-footed house mice that appeared a while ago, and is now breeding true. Racine, Wis.—UPD—Sink-installed garbage disposers will wash an estimated 4,745,000 pounds of garbage down the drain in 1960, an industry spokesman says. Ever J. Hammes, a local disposer manufacturer (In-Sink-Erator Manufacturing Co.) based his estimate on the more than 4,500,000 disposers currently in use. He estimated 949 pounds of garbage are produced annually by an average family of four.
