Date and Nut Bars

Festive Delight
It is Date Festival time at Indio in California's Coachella valley, date growing center of the United States. Here a beautiful oasis of date palms reproduces a romantic array of old world atmosphere for this exotic fruit, the candy that grows on trees.

Dates are delectable for eating out-of-hand, for stuffing with nuts, fondant or pineapple chunks. They're delicious added to hot cereal; for the making of breads, muffins, cookies, waffles, cup cakes and other goodies like these date-nut bars.

- 3 eggs, separated
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 cup chopped California dates
- 1 cup chopped nuts

Beat egg yolks until light. Add sugar and beat until creamy. Sift flour and baking powder; add chopped dates and chopped nuts. Mix well so that all are well-coated and separate. Add flour mixture to eggs and sugar.

Beat egg whites until stiff but not dry and add to mixture. Pour into shallow pan that has been greased and floured, and bake 30 minutes at 325 degrees. Cool and cut into bars 1 1/2 inches x 3 inches and roll in powdered sugar.

Toss Grapefruit Salad
Enjoy plentiful, juice-laden, refreshing grapefruit, whole, halved, in segments or as juice. Enjoy it too in salads like this one tossed with greens.

- 1/2 head lettuce
- 1/2 head curly endive
- 1/2 head romaine
- 1 cup fresh grapefruit sections
- 1/2 cup sliced cucumbers
- 1/2 diced green pepper
- 1/4 cup onion rings
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 cup salad oil
- 2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice

Combine washed and dried salad greens, grapefruit, cucumbers, green peppers, onion rings, salt, salad oil and lemon juice; toss lightly. Garnish with additional grapefruit sections, cucumbers and/or onion rings if you like. Eight servings.

Latin Flank Steak Proves Versatility of Concentrated Tomato Juice

The South Americans have a way with the less expensive flank steak and it is extraordinarily good. A scored steak is sprinkled with salt, pepper, parsley, garlic and concentrated cheese, then baked in a sauce of concentrated tomato juice and oregano; find that the tomato juice tenderizes the flank and seasons it through and through. Five generous servings.

But first a word about concentrated tomato juice. It comes in a 6 1/2 ounce can that can be quickly turned into rich, full-flavored juice by adding three cans of water. To use as a sauce or in recipes calling for tomato sauce, combine equal parts of concentrate and water. In recipes calling for tomato paste, simply use it just as it comes from the can. A very good item to have on hand.

- 1 1/2 to 2 pound flank steak, scored
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon pepper
- 2 tablespoons minced parsley
- 1 small clove garlic, minced
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 1 tablespoon salad oil
- 1 can (6 1/2 ounce) concentrated tomato juice
- 1 can water
- 1/4 teaspoon oregano

Sprinkle one side of flank steak with salt and next four ingredients. Roll steak tightly, jelly-roll fashion; secure with string. In a skillet or Dutch oven, brown in oil on all sides. Combine concentrated tomato juice, water and oregano (use either crumbled leaves or powdered); pour over steak.

Simmer, covered, about two hours or until tender. Add additional water if sauce seems thicker than you like. Slice meat and serve sauce remaining in pan separately.

Staple Groceries Given Top Billing

Always we talk about best buys in poultry, meats, fish, fresh fruits and vegetables. Today for a change we're looking over good old staples, finding seasonally low prices on many good things usually found in pantry shelves; good eating at low cost.

The Legumes. That means good old dry beans, peas, lentils, peanuts, all packed with excellent food values at very small cost. Variety too, for there are kidney beans, limas, Great Northern, pintos, pea beans, split and whole peas, lentils, and in the peanut section, there's peanut butter. When buying dry beans and their cousins, figure a pound to provide 8 generous servings. Keep peanut butter in

the house at all times for satisfying hungry hordes; other people's children as well as your own.

Orange Products, Raisins. There's an abundance of frozen orange juice concentrate as well as fresh oranges. Fine crop too of quality raisins for enjoyment in many ways.

Canned Foods. Fruits to top shopping lists and priced to justify "stocking up" include cling and freestone peaches, whole and jellied cranberry sauce, apple sauce. Favorite vegetables that are good buys include canned peas and sauerkraut. Genuine bargain, too in tuna for sandwiches, salads, casserole dishes; and in our good west coast-packed sardines which come in oval cans in a variety of sauces.

Eggs, Poultry. Plenty of high quality eggs and lots of broiler-fryers; both important in the economy of our state. Proximity of growing areas helps keep prices low.

Meat Situation. Here it pays big to scan the advertisements because different merchandisers feature different meats, take pride in special buys, are likely to offer several cuts of same type of meat. So look around for family favorites.

Vegetable Buys. Menu planners find a wealth of good things; broccoli, green cabbage, carrots, lettuce, cauliflower, mushrooms, dry yellow onions, spinach, celery, sweet potatoes, bunched vegetables.

Fruit Displays. Plenty of apples, avocados, Emperor grapes and huge displays of oranges, grapefruit and lemons so important for their vitamin C at this season.

Diamonds Stolen By Holdup Pair

Sealed proposals will be received by the undersigned until 3 o'clock P.M., Standard Oregon Time, on the 7th day of March, 1960, and immediately thereafter will be publicly opened by the District School Board of School District No. 62, Jackson County, Oregon, for the purchase, at not less than par and accrued interest, of the following described negotiable general-obligation coupon bonds of said school district in the principal amount of \$10,000, dated February 1, 1960, in denominations of \$1,000 each, and maturing serially in annual order as follows: \$10,000 on the first day of February, 1961, and \$15,000 on the first day of February of each year thereafter to and including February 1, 1968.

The bonds will bear interest payable semiannually at such rate as shall be determined by the board of directors of the school district, not exceeding 6 per cent per annum, as shall be specified by the successful bidder. Both the principal of and the interest upon the bonds will be paid at the office of the county treasurer of Jackson County, Oregon.

The bonds will be sold to the highest bidder, but the district school board reserves the right to reject any or all bids. Unless all bids are rejected the bonds will be awarded to the bidder complying with the terms of the notice of sale, and providing the lowest cost to the school district.

Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check or cashier's check in favor of the district, or upon a bank doing business in the state of Oregon, in the sum of \$500, and must be enclosed in a sealed envelope addressed to the undersigned and marked on the outside "Proposals for Bonds." No interest will be allowed on the deposit with the bid, but the district may accept any bid resulting from failure of the bidder to comply with the terms of the bid.

Each bidder shall include in his bid a statement of the total interest cost to the district if he is accepted.

The successful bidder will be furnished with the written opinion of Shuler, Sayre, Winfree and Rankin, to the effect that the bonds constitute the valid and legally binding obligations of the said school district.

The bonds will be delivered complete, without undue delay, at the expense of the successful bidder, at such city in Oregon as the successful bidder shall name.
