It will stand in any court today. Its terms are precise and unchanging. They require strict obedience and must be interpreted correctly. To inherit eternal life you must be obedient to every command and precept.

### Christ's will and testament has four distinct divisions.

Four books of biography called the gospels. These record the birth of Christ, his childhood, baptism, teaching, miracles, his enemies, trial, death, resurrection, and his return to heaven.

### Next is one book of history; an explanation of how, when and where the Church was established and how to become a Christian.

### Following this book of Acts are twenty-one books or letters teaching how to live the Christian life.

### It closes with a book of revelation, concerning the future of the Church, and a description of the heavenly home of the faithful.
