The Medical Roundup

Surgical Removal of Spleen

Quite a few people who have had their spleen removed write me to ask if they are likely to miss it in some way. They are afraid they will come to grief because it was taken from them. Usually it is removed to cure a certain type of anemia. The spleen has to do with removing from the blood old and worn out red blood cells. Sometimes it gets to destroying these cells a bit too actively, and this may produce an anemia which can be cured by a splenectomy.

We don't know as much about the functions of the spleen as we would like to. When I was a medical student there was a classic story about a professor who asked a student what were the functions of the spleen. The young man hemmed and hawed, and said, "I'm sorry, professor, I know that yesterday, but I've forgotten it." And the professor said to the class, "What a tragedy; here is the only man in the world who ever knew the functions of the spleen, and he's gone and forgotten them!"

Does Drinking Liquor Add To a Person's Weight?

People ask if the drinking of a considerable amount of liquor every evening can add to the person's weight, and the answer is "Yes." Alcohol can be used in the body as a fuel and a food. It is not a good food because it lacks all of those elements, such as protein, salts and vitamins, that make a satisfying food.

Pyrorrhea

What is pyorrhea, and what can be done for it? Pyorrhea is a disease of the sockets of the teeth which attacks people, often when they are past middle age and when they have had unusually good teeth all of their days. Often then the teeth can be saved if the patient will start going to a good dentist who will "scale" the teeth well. With the surfaces of the teeth made smooth, the sockets may take hold again, and much of the inflammation in them will quiet down. But the person and his dentist must make a strong and continued effort.
