Nation's 1980 Water Need Expected To Be 600 Billion Gallons

Washington — U. S. water needs will jump from 250 billion gallons a day to 600 billion gallons a day by 1980. That's the estimate received by the Senate Select Committee on National Water Resources, which recently completed the first phase of its investigation into water potentials for the next 20 years. Experts told the committee the U.S. has the capacity to meet the increasing need, but not all of it is developed. The industrial East, with its need for electric power, is already beginning to feel the squeeze for more water, and farmers in the West who need water for irrigation have felt it for years.

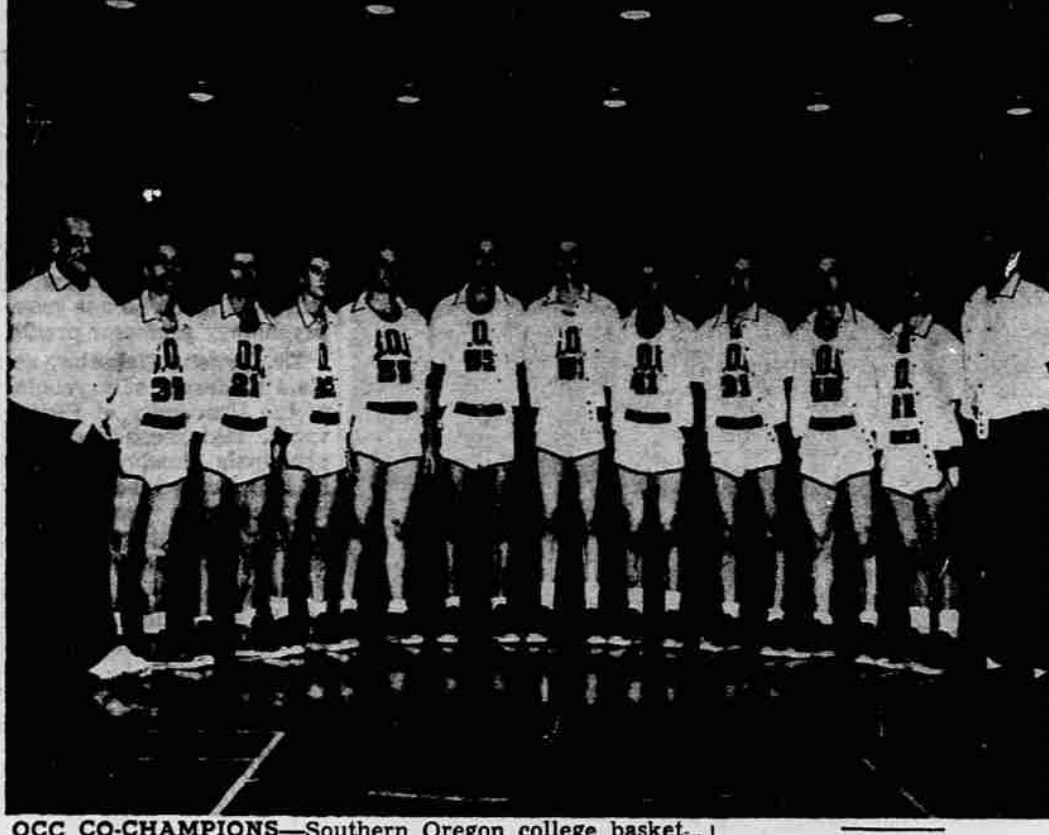
