Many years ago, when I was little boy, I got started on my first bit of medical research. It began when my mother found me taking a sliver out of my finger with a pin. Naturally, she said, "Don't do that; take a needle." I asked, "But, why?" And mother said, "Because the pin is brass and the needle is iron." Again, I asked, "What difference does that make?" All Mother could say was that everyone knew that one must never remove a sliver with a pin, and I had better stop asking questions because she was busy.

For the next 40 years kept asking grandmother Why use a needle, and never a pin. All agreed that needles were important, but never did I find anyone who could explain why brass was bad and iron was good. In the meantime I had started collecting a library of books on medical folklore, and eventually found an answer that satisfied me. I wrote an article on the subject which I presented at the meeting of the Smithsonian Institution in Washington that they re-published in their big annual volume.
