Yankee Hopes Rest on Carol

Vancouver, B.C. — (UPI) — U.S. hopes rested today on Carol Heiss, 20, Ozone Park, N.Y., to retain her ladies singles title at the World Figure Skating championship. Canada took the first two places in Wednesday night's pairs competition.

The winner will be decided tonight at the conclusion of the free skating competition at which Carol excels. Carol, who won a gold medal for the U.S. at the Olympics in Squaw Valley last week, performed almost flawlessly to top her 23 competitors in the six figures which were skated Tuesday and Wednesday.

Highlight of the championships to date was the pairs competition Wednesday night, in which Olympic gold medalists Barbara Wagner and Bob Paul of Toronto scored an overwhelming victory.

Second was the brother-sister team of Maria and Otto Jelinek of Oakville, Ont., formerly of Czechoslovakia, with 101.5 points.

Mickey Mantle Stays at Home

Dallas — (UPI) — Mickey Mantle acted last night as if it doesn't make much difference whether he plays for New York this year or not. The Yankee slugger made it plain in a television interview that there's bad feeling between himself and the club and that he wouldn't mind too much being traded.

While the Yankees opened spring training at St. Petersburg, Fla., Mantle stayed at his home in Dallas and officially became a holdout for the first time in his career. "A fellow who is a holdout naturally gets to be feeling a little bit bad toward the club," he said.

Mantle and the Yankees have been having a contract dispute reportedly over the club trying to cut the slugger's salary by at least \$10,000.

Evansville Voted No. 1 By Coaches

New York — (UPI) — The Evansville (Ind.) Purple Aces, poised to defend their NCAA basketball title, today were chosen the nation's No. 1 small college team for the regular 1959-60 season by the United Press International Board of Coaches.

In its final balloting of the campaign, the nationwide board gave Coach Arad (Mac) McCutchan's Purple Aces 24 first-place votes and 368 points. Evansville was picked by the coaches in their pre-season steeple as the team most likely to wind up as the top small college team and led the ratings 13 consecutive weeks.

Evansville (20-4) begins defense of its NCAA small college crown tonight against Arkansas State in the Midwest regionals at Evansville.
