

Association Files Articles in Salem

Articles of incorporation have been filed in Salem for Rogue Wonderland association, Prospect, a civic service organization aimed at the betterment of business on Highway 62.

Signing the articles were Richard G. Easten, owner of a McLeod motel; Kenneth Oliver, electrical repair shop operator, Trail; and Mrs. Doris Boothby, sporting goods store co-owner.

Mrs. Boothby reported that present activities of the organization are concerned with improvement of the highway to Crater lake, with emphasis on improved maintenance.

Two Rogue Wonderland association representatives, Easten and Leo Hoag, are scheduled to speak to the state highway commission in Salem March 11 concerning the highway.

G.P. Businessman Seeks Office

Grants Pass - William I. Davidson, Grants Pass businessman, has announced his candidacy for the state legislature to represent Josephine county in the house of representatives. He is a Democrat.

Davidson, 45, served three and one-half years in the Navy during World War II. He was employed in the lumber and plywood industry for several years and, with his wife, now operates a tool and equipment distribution concern in Grants Pass.

He has pledged energetic support of the Democratic platform because, he said, he feels "that it is a statement of the wishes of the people and deserves the wholehearted support of those who believe in the fundamentals of government of the people, by the people and for the people."

Air Line Improves Communications

Pacific Air Lines has completed installation of new equipment on its communications network linking cities it serves in California, Oregon and Nevada.

Basic equipment in the new network is a teletypewriter operating on a private line circuit that can transmit 100 words a minute, a development of Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company, T. R. Mitchell, air lines executive vice president, announced.

Pacific Air Lines stations in all three states are connected with the relay center at San Francisco International airport, which is also the control station.

Under the system, only the station to which a message is directed will be able to receive it. Installation of the faster system was made necessary because of rapid growth of the air line brought about by additions of new aircraft and extension of routes during the last few years, Mitchell explained.

Co. Announces Employees' Profits

Western Auto Supply company contributed \$1,666,695 to its employees profit sharing and retirement program for 1959, amounting to 15 per cent of the base pay of 2,232 participating employees.

A. C. Swanson, company president, announced that of the \$1,666,695 a total of \$872,660 was deposited in the profit sharing trust, providing a 1959 credit for each participating employee of slightly more than four weeks pay.

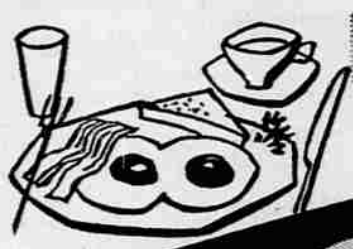
Sixty-four retired persons are now drawing monthly checks from the retirement trust.
