

Trombone Trio On Program

One of the instrumental groups to be featured in the first band festival ever to be held by Medford High schools will be a trombone trio. Members of the trio are Harold Young, Joe Beatty and Harold Bailey.

The festival concert is set for Thursday, March 10, at 8 p.m. at Hedrick Junior High school. Originally set for Friday, the concert was set up one day because of the start of the spring vacation.

According to I. A. Mirick, band director at Medford High school, all three boys have played trombone in the Medford school system since grade school days.

A total of 420 students are expected to play in the festival Thursday night. Two bands from each McLoughlin and Hedrick Junior High schools will play, and Medford High school will be represented by the Senior Symphony band and the full concert band.

Another soloist to be featured is Linda Hess, saxophonist.

In one number, majorettes from each school will perform.

Tickets for the performance may be purchased from any band member.

Princess To Be Wed On May 6

London - (UPI) - Princess Margaret and Antony Armstrong-Jones will be married in Westminster Abbey May 6, it was announced officially today.

Prince Philip will give the princess away and the Archbishop of Canterbury will conduct the service.

Announcement of the date was made after a London newspaper, The Daily Mail, came out with it in a headline this morning.

The announcement was issued from Clarence House, Margaret's residence.

"The marriage of Her Royal Highness the Princess Margaret with Mr. Antony Armstrong-Jones will be solemnized at Westminster Abbey on the morning of Friday, 6th May, at 11:30 o'clock," it said simply.

There was no immediate indication who else would be in the bridal party.

The announcement meant a short engagement. The betrothal was announced only 12 days ago, although Margaret and the former society photographer have known each other for two years.

Plans already are being made for the greatest influx of visitors to Britain for a royal event since Queen Elizabeth II, Margaret's sister, was crowned in the Abbey in 1953.

Sources close to the palace said "it seems a certainty" the wedding would be a magnificent, colorful event with royal carriage processions to and from the ancient Abbey.

It was learned that Queen Elizabeth disclosed the wedding date Tuesday night to Prime Minister Harold Macmillan at Buckingham Palace.

Her reception of Macmillan was her first official engagement since the birth of her third child nearly three weeks ago.

Now that the date has been set, plans for the wedding will go forward with great speed at Buckingham Palace, Clarence House and the office of the Lord Chamberlain, who is responsible to the Queen for royal ceremonies.

Harlalee Wilson Booked As Soloist for Concert

A violinist of talent and experience will be soloist for the spring concert of the Philharmonic Society of Southern Oregon. The musician is Harlalee Wilson, well known to southern Oregon audiences since he lived in Ashland as a student and has made many appearances in recent years.

The concert in which Mr. Wilson will be featured is set for Sunday, March 13 at 3 p.m. in Medford High school auditorium. Mr. Wilson's number will be the Wieniawski "Violin Concerto No. 2 in D minor." Richard D. Werner, under whom the soloist studied for some time, will conduct.

In 1950 while Mr. Wilson was a student of Conductor Werner he won a scholarship to Tanglewood for the summer season. There he played under the famous Koussevitzky, who died soon after.

That winter the young violinist was recalled for further active duty in the United States Air Force, with which he had previously served. Following that tour of duty, he entered the Los Angeles Conservatory of Music and studied with Sacha Jacobsen. Young Wilson also did some teaching and served as assistant concertmaster of the Conservatory orchestra.

While at the Conservatory Mr. Wilson appeared in solo and chamber music recitals in Pasadena, at the Ebell theater in Los Angeles and played at the University of Southern California.

During this period he played with the Pasadena Civic Symphony orchestra under Richard Lert, and filled engagements in television, opera, and oratorio performances in the Los Angeles area.

From 1955 to 1958 the violinist divided his time between engagements with the Denver Symphony orchestra and with

Russ Morgan's orchestra. For the 1958-59 season, and for the present season he is with the Portland Symphony orchestra. He also teaches string instruments for Parkrose schools.

Mr. Wilson is also working on his master's thesis in music.

Mr. Wilson is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence Wilson, Ashland. After attending Ashland schools, he took college and university work at Willamette, Lewis and Clark and the University of Oregon.

Tickets for the concert are on sale at Purucker's Music House, Medford, and the Music Mart, Ashland.
