The Medical Roundup

A Trouble-Shooting Clinic

In a recent number of the Journal of the American Medical Association, Milton Golins told of a remarkable experiment that has been carried out with great success at the City Hospital in Queens, N. Y., where since September, 1958, more than 750 men, women, and children have come in to get help with some disturbing problem. For instance, a clerk's marriage was going on the rocks because of a trouble-making mother-in-law in his home. A stenographer was all upset because of the constant jealousy of her boy-friend. A busy housewife had gotten involved with some feuding neighbors. An elderly widower was being harassed by his "crazy" son. A high-school girl was all at sea because of the breaking-up of her home. A truck driver was badly depressed because of the death of a loved one.

Today hundreds of thousands of such people, when they go into a doctor's office, are not allowed to sit and talk it out as they so want to do. Perhaps the doctor's nurse says, "You cannot see the doctor until all your tests and x-ray studies are made." Perhaps the patient has a pile of x-ray films and lab reports just made for another doctor, but the new one won't look at them; he wants his own men to make new studies. Many Doctors Worried

This sort of thing worries many doctors today, because there are hundreds of thousands of people who need only to talk with a wise and kindly man. Time and again, after I have let a troubled woman talk for half an hour, she has said, "I am all right now; I see what I must do, and I will go and do it. It is better to put up with an annoyance than to be fighting it every day." Once I was surprised because, after I had talked for a while with a nice woman, she got up and said, "I am cured; I am all right." And I, puzzled, asked, "But how did you get cured?" And she said, "I thought I had committed an unpardonable sin; I thought I should be a pariah despised by everyone; but I can see from your kindly attitude that you, who know now what I did, you like me—so I feel clean again."

Particularly needed today are clinics in which for a reasonable fee a patient can get opinions from a number of people, and especially people who have several skills, in social work, psychiatric nursing, and legal aid. To show how one of these clinics works: one day, shortly after the close of World War II, a young cab driver walked into the clinic in New York, worried to death because he couldn't get a driver's license. Without it, he could not support his wife and three children. The bureau had refused him a license because his Army discharge read, "for psychoneurosis," and the clerk thought this meant he was insane. Perfectly Sane

Within the next hour these several things happened: A psychologist in the clinic quickly satisfied himself that the man had all of the necessary intelligence and good sense and self-control to be a cab driver. Next, a psychiatrist decided the man might be nervous, but he certainly was perfectly sane. Next, a social worker called up the licensing bureau and found out just what type of certificate would be needed to satisfy the authorities and remove

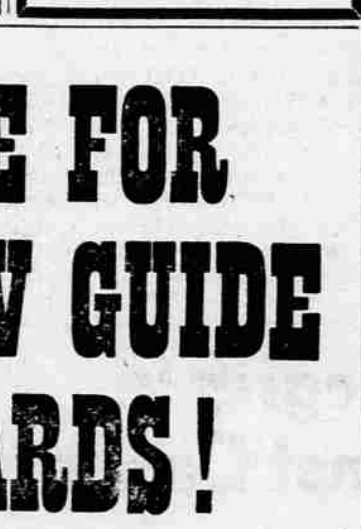
around to the idea of practicing some type of group medicine for a reasonable fee. I think we will all agree that clinics such as the one I just read about should be established in every city. I know that there's many a kindly doctor who, when faced by a difficult problem of social service which is quite out of his line, would like to send the patient to a group of people who could tackle the problem with several special skills.

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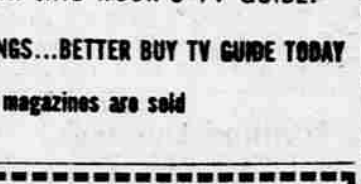


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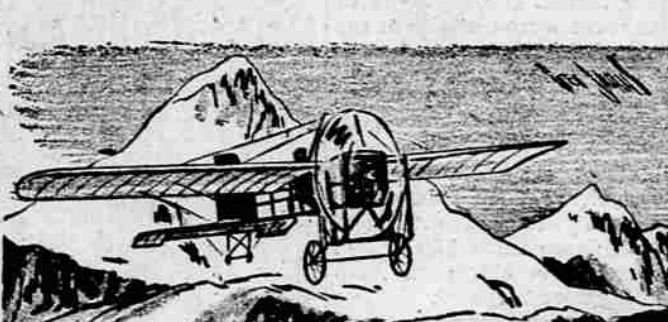
