U. of Georgia Coach Dies

Athens, Ga. — (UPI) — Most of his friends agreed that J. B. (Ears) Whitworth, one of football's greatest line coaches, died of a broken heart.

A heart attack apparently killed Whitworth some time last week but his body wasn't discovered until Monday by a neighbor. Whitworth's wife was visiting relatives in New York and his son was at school at the University of Alabama.

He had "come home" to the University of Georgia as line coach just a year ago after a heart-breaking series of reverses as head coach at Oklahoma A & M and the University of Alabama. He called this past year the happiest of his career.

Whitworth, a native of Blytheville, Ark., was a hard-rocking guard at the University of Alabama in his playing days and kicked a field goal against Washington State in the 1931 Rose Bowl game.

Ted's Neck Top Secret

The condition of Ted Williams' neck has become a top secret item in the Boston Red Sox' training camp.

Manager Billy Jurges supplied the new Williams twist when he placed a taboo on any mention of neck injuries. Only a week ago the 41-year-old slugger had said the painful ailment could force him to retire.

"Don't even ask Ted how his neck is," Jurges told reporters. "Let's let it go at that."

Williams, meanwhile, appeared improved to newsmen who watched him go through Monday's workout. He no longer carries his neck to one side and he was blasting away in batting practice with his old zest and lecturing younger players on hitting.

Williams is attempting a comeback after his 1959 batting average fell to an all-time low of .254.

Suspended Tilt Rule Adopted
