Cheese-Potato Dish
This cheese-potato dish is delectable. To make 6 servings: in a buttered shallow baking dish, arrange in a single layer 2 packages frozen French fried potato sticks. Brush with 1/4 cup (1/2 stick) melted butter and sprinkle with 1 teaspoon onion salt and paprika. Bake 20-25 minutes in a preheated 425 degree oven. Remove from oven and sprinkle with 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese, shaking pan so potatoes are evenly coated.
