Adlai Not To Be Entered in Primary

Portland—UPI—The Oregon Draft Stevenson committee has decided that it would "not be in the best interests" of ex-Gov. Adlai Stevenson of Illinois to enter him in the May 20 Oregon presidential primary.

Paul R. Meyer, Portland attorney and head of the committee, said Thursday that the favorite son provisions of Oregon law have "confused and diminished" the national effect of the primary. Sen. Wayne Morse (D-Ore.) is running as a favorite son.

Meyer said that those on the committee who have worked hard for Stevenson "are still dedicated to his ultimate nomination and election."

Said Meyer: "We think there is a good chance he will win in Los Angeles."

He added that the decision to remove Stevenson's name from the Oregon ballot was merely a "strategy" decision.

State Penitentiary Inmate Hangs Self
Salem—UPI—A knotted sheet tied to a wall electrical fixture Tuesday night served as a noose for a state prison inmate who hanged himself.

The victim, Edgar Lloyd Hamrick, 34, committed suicide in an isolation unit, authorities said.

Hamrick was serving a total of 35 years. An armed robbery and assault charge in Coos county resulted in a 15-year sentence in 1949 and 20 years were added for a Yamhill county offense.

A guard checked him at 7:20 p.m. and he was "okay." When the guard came around only minutes later, the inmate was dead.

Deputies located Ridders behind the bar in the lounge of the lodge with a loaded rifle beside him. He did not resist arrest, deputies said.

Washington—UPI—Col. Arturo Ramirez Pinto, Guatemalan ambassador to the United States, died early today of an apparent heart attack.

An embassy spokesman said the 66-year-old ambassador was stricken about 3 a.m. (c.s.t.) at his apartment in the Windsor Park hotel. He died about an hour later at the Washington Hospital Center, the spokesman said.

The ambassador is survived by his widow and two grown sons, one in Baton Rouge, La., and the other in Pittsburgh, Pa.
