ORAL VACCINE FOR POLIO

I recently read a note by Dr. Dorothy M. Horstmann, of Yale University, saying that more than 10 million Russian children have been vaccinated with one of the "live" polio virus vaccines which is taken by mouth. The Russians say that the incidence of paralytic polio among the people now vaccinated has been very low. By the end of this year the Russians hope to have vaccinated all of their younger citizens. In spite of this enormous experience that the Russians and many health authorities in Africa and Central America have had, our officials have been reluctant to let the material be tested in this country. The fear is that the weakened virus used may regain its strength during its passage through human beings. To me, it is reassuring that in the last 150 years the live vaccine that we have been using to protect us against smallpox has not reverted to its original very dangerous form. It was Dr. William Jenner who, in 1798, reported his discovery that when the often-deadly, dealing virus of smallpox was passed through a cow it lost so much of its strength that thereafter it could rarely cause more than a slight illness in a human being—but what little illness it produced would protect the person from getting smallpox.

A Curious Cancer Discovery
As I keep saying in this column, we never know whence may some day come the key discovery that will lead to a cure for at least one type of cancer. I was just reading that the scientists at the great Sloan-Kettering In-

stitute for Cancer Research in New York City have found that BCG, the vaccine which stimulates the body's natural defenses against tuberculosis, greatly increases the resistance of mice to a certain form of cancer called sarcoma 180. Ordinarily the mice would die with this disease, but when given BCG they recover.

Treatment for Porphyria
A few people want to know what can be done for porphyria. In the past, about all one could say was, don't take barbiturates because they can produce a violent and even fatal flare-up; and don't get operated on if you can help it. People with porphyria have inherited a tendency to nervousness and abdominal pain. Sometimes in an acute spell, their urine, if put in the sun, turns red. In some cases the skin is so sensitive to the sun that it blisters, and little scars result.

Now, a new drug called tri-fluoperazine is being used, and some men are reporting good results with it. The so-called maintenance dose is 10 mg. a day.
