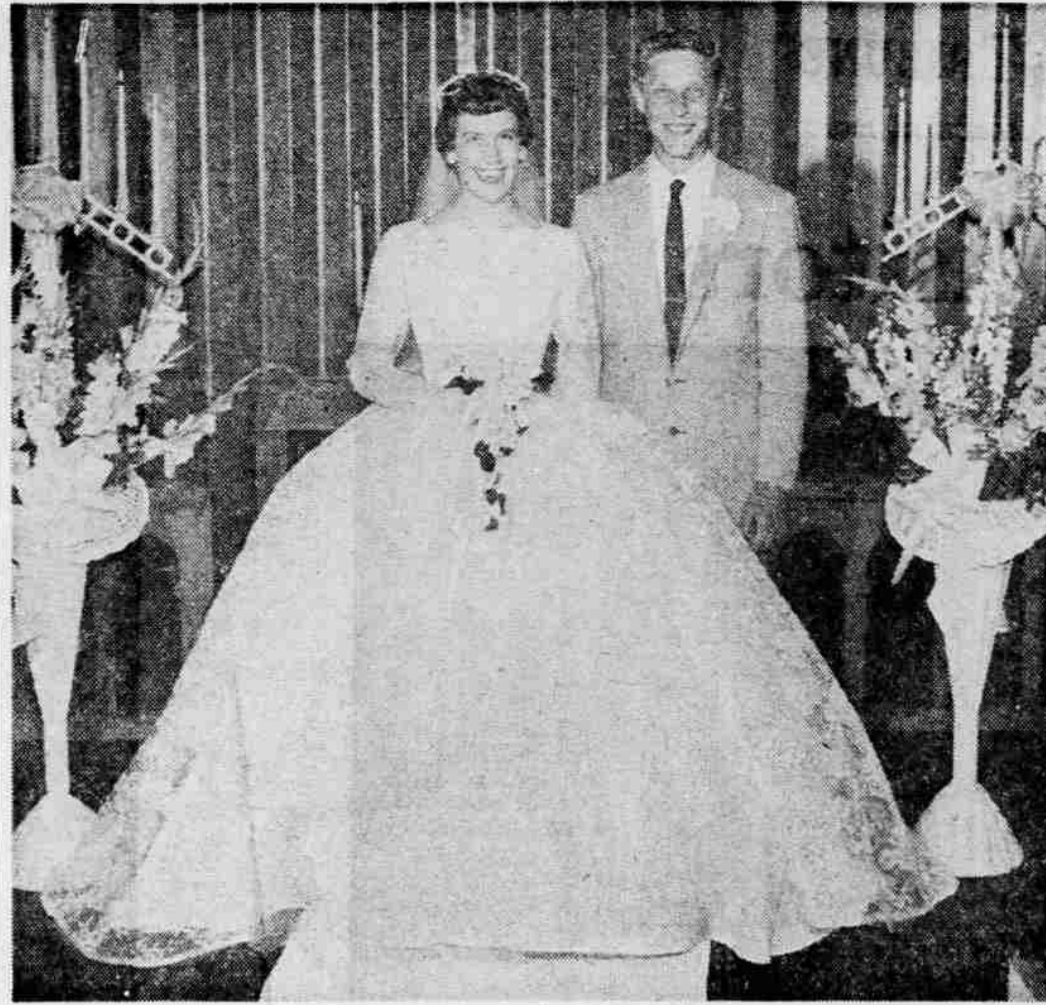
**Past Matrons Club Announces Meeting**
