



Servite Fathers To Conduct Parish Mission

A parish mission, conducted by the Servite Fathers, will be held in Sacred Heart Catholic church from Sunday, March 28 through Saturday, March 30, according to a recent announcement.

The mission will be open to both Catholics and non-Catholics.

Services will include morning masses each day, followed by short doctrinal instructions. In the evening the Servite missionary will lead the congregation in the recitation of the seven dolors rosary, after which there will be a period of instruction, congregational singing and a sermon. The evening program will end with benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

Confessions will be heard every night following the

services and during the mission masses in the morning. Custom and Practice

According to Roman Catholic custom and practice, the parish mission gives the laity the opportunity of renewing their religious fervor by attending a series of religious exercises and hearing the sermons of priests sent into the parish. The exercises vary, depending upon the particular Order conducting the mission. The sermons, however, usually deal with such fundamentals of Christian life as the purpose of man; sin; redemption; the justice, mercy, love and graces of God; death; heaven and hell.

While the Servites have parishes, seminaries and mission establishments throughout the world, they are best known in the Northwest because of their National Sanctuary of Our Sorrowful Mother (popularly known as "The Grotto") in Portland.

There they hold year-round public devotions, and missionaries from the Sanctuary are regularly engaged in conducting parish missions, novenas, forty hours devotions and retreats.

This will be their first mission in Sacred Heart parish. Specific hours of services and other details of the mission will be announced later.

Russia Buys Four U.S. Helicopters

Washington—UPI—The Soviet Union has purchased four helicopters in this country for the use of Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev and other top Russian officials.

A Soviet Embassy spokesman said Thursday that the helicopters and spare parts were bought from the Sikorsky Aircraft Co., Bridgeport, Conn., and the Vertol Aircraft Corp., Morton, Pa., for \$2 million.

Delivery to Russia is expected late this year.

Guilty Plea Made In Aiding Escapes

Salem—UPI—A state hospital psychiatric worker who helped two dangerous inmates escape waived District Court hearing Thursday and pleaded guilty to two counts of aiding and abetting the escape.

Circuit Judge Val D. Sloper ordered a presentence investigation for Harry Draper Symons Jr., 29, the hospital aide. Symons faces a maximum sentence of 40 years, 20 on each count.

Symons confessed to slipping hacksaw blades which permitted James Norman Jensen and Jack Stanton Amason to flee the criminal insane ward last week.

Congress Urged To Require TV Time

Washington—UPI—Two Democratic senators have urged Congress to require free television time for presidential candidates in order to bring the "great debate" of this election year into the nation's homes.

They offered a bill designed to provide free time at "prime" viewing hours to major party candidates. Each candidate would get two half-hour periods a week from each network and local station.

The bill was offered by Chairman Warren G. Magnuson (D-Wash.) and Sen. A. S. (Mike) Monroney (D-Okla.), a member of the Senate Interstate Commerce committee. Sens. Estes Kefauver (D-Tenn.), John O. Pastore (D-R.I.) and Frank Church (D-Ida.), signed up as co-sponsors.

Magnuson said the bill, as now drafted, would provide time for presidential candidates only, except the vice presidential aspirant for each party could substitute on two of the free programs scheduled every week during the eight weeks preceding election day.

The Family Council

Editor's Note: The Family Council consists of a Judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a woman's editor and two writers. Each article is a summary of an actual case history. The Council reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and counselors.

Mrs. E. K.—Paula has no friends.

Paula K.—My parents should leave me alone.

Mrs. E. K.—My husband and I are quite concerned about our 21-year-old daughter, Paula, who is suddenly without social life.

Paula went to a junior college for two years, hoping to transfer to a regular college at the end of that time. Unfortunately, her parents weren't what they should have been and she didn't get into the college she wanted. She came home and started a secretarial course, but dropped it in the middle. She goes out sometimes looking for a job, but never finds anything suitable.

We don't mind her staying home and not working as we can well afford to take care of her. The only trouble is that she isn't meeting any people and rarely sees any of her old friends. She has one faithful boy friend whom she goes out with every week end, but she admits he's a jerk.

Paula K.—My parents keep telling me to call up my old friends, but I just can't do that. Most of them have gotten married. Some of them are away at college and rarely come home. I don't have much in common with either group.

I realize I have to find some social life, but it isn't easy when all your friends are a way or married. Of course, I could meet people at a job, but I don't have the qualifications for a job in a good place.

I feel that I'm at a sort of crossroads in my life and my parents should leave me alone until I'm sure of what to do next. If worse comes to worse and nothing comes my way I can always marry Faithful Fred.

The Council: Most of us encounter a crossroads or uncertain period in our lives and we need to be left alone to figure things out. Paula is right in asking for a let-up of pressure from her parents.

Yet we wonder whether she is actually going through such a period or a general slump that does not bode well for the future. We think her difficulties may go deeper than her parents suspect and that her lack of friends is just one sign of inner trouble.

We get the impression that Paula is retreating from taking an active role on behalf of her own life. She is too ready to leave things to chance. She should recognize that chance is a poor master. It operates blindly, senselessly and few of its moves are in favor of the individual who depends on it.

Paula's failure to get into college was a blow, but judging from her general attitude we suspect that she did not make an all-out effort to succeed. Some wrong idea or emotional obstruction stood between her and her goal and we think she should try earnestly to overcome it.

We don't think this can be done by sitting at home and mulling. Paula should force herself to make a decision about the immediate future. Dropping the secretarial course was a bad idea because she is setting a pattern of failure and half-attempts. This can go on endlessly. She should set a reasonable goal and make up her mind to go through with it.

Paula shows that she is far from ready for marriage. If

she wants marriage now or in the near future, she should make an effort to meet people and attract desirable men. She should not use "Faithful Fred" as a substitute for the necessary course of action.
